HAMANTASHEN

Dough Filling:

4 Cups flour½ lb. butter or margarine2 cups lackwa (prune butter)¼ cup sugar2 eggs½ cup ground almonds¼ tsp. Salt½ cup sour cream1 table grated orange rind

Combine flour, sugar and salt. Cut in butter. Stir in eggs. Add sour cream and mix dough lightly until it holds together. Chill about 15 minutes.

Combine filling ingredients. Roll dough 1/8 inch thick on lightly floured board. Cut into 4-inch rounds. Put about 1 table of filling in the center of each round and pinch edges together in 3 places to form a triangle. Allow a little filling to show in center. Bake on lightly greased cookie sheet in preheated 350° oven for 25 to 30 minutes, until light gold.


