#### Rabbi Says:

" David Melek Yisroel, Hai, Hai V'Kayyam "(David King of Israel Lives and Thrives) Children's Song.

In late March, Mina, Joshua and I attended a Persian New Year celebration in Balboa Park. On one of the Farsi-English newspapers, I noticed the dual winged Eagle

that is the symbol of Pre-Islamic Persia. I had seen it before on people, worn as a necklace, but its significance had not struck me until that day. People were trying to separate themselves from the present Islamic government of Iran by going back to an earlier civilization.

I then thought about what I wear around my neck. I wear an angel, 2 electro engraved plates showing the boys and my dad and two charms that represent our people. They both have Stars of David on them, the symbol of our people and of the State of Israel. One is the emblem of an American Jewish Military Chaplain, where the star is above the Ten Commandments and the other has a menorah inside the star. Both represent Israel to me. Israel who wrestles with Angels is represented by the Ten Commandments because any one who wrestles with good and evil, law and discord, rules and anarchy carries on the work started by the first Israel. The menorah inside the star is the role Israel serves for our people and the world. We are to enlighten the world with the eternal ness of the Jewish people. We are to bring to the nations of the world our identity. We are to help them

find timelessness in their own symbols. I could never imagine wearing an emblem that predates my identity, religious or otherwise. I believe in what our ancestor sought to do and what the present Land of Israel, albeit in a smaller version, seeks to do. Israel celebrates its 60<sup>th</sup> birthday this month. Every time I have been to Israel, I have marveled how many "Jewish Stars", I see. Their emblem is my emblem. Their history, all the way back to the first days of the 'Land of Israel' and beyond is my history. Their language is my language, especially when they describe the "Star of David" as a "Mogen David" (Shield of David) for they make a point that the six pointed star emblem has been used by people in the air, on land and sea to rescue and protect Jews. From the Israeli Air Force in 1967 to the Commandoes at Entebbe to Mogen David Adom, the shield has protected us, always. As such we don't need to search for an earlier expression of Jewish soul. It is there in the beloved double Dalet of Melek David. We all have our own memories of Israel and things Israeli. One of my favorite memories of the Magen David is on the fuselage of an F-4 Phantom Jet as it 'buzzed' myself and my friends as we walked in the Judean Hills surrounding Jerusalem on the 1971 Annual 50 kilometer walk into Jerusalem. The joy and pride that star brought raised us up as no other emblem could. In the coming days, weeks and months, we need to "see" how the beloved Double Dalet of Melek David has raised our souls. Then we will begin to know the place Israel has in our hearts. May she live to be 120 centuries.

#### TBE ADOPTS NEW PRAYER BOOK!

I am very excited to announce that upon the recommendation of Rabbi Mark and the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors have adopted a new prayer book for Shabbat, Weekdays and Festivals. *Mishkan T'Filah* is the new siddur published by the Central Conference of American Rabbis, the rabbinic arm of the Reform movement in America. This is the first new siddur from the movement in some 30 years, and is the result of over 20 years of development.

New prayer books were needed because out current books have deteriorated to the point where many of them are nearly unusable. Our books were intended as an interim volume between the 1975 version of *Gates of Prayer* and the new siddur now being introduced. Our books are now out of print. We have been investigating possible replacements for some time. Our attention was drawn to *Mishkan T'Filah* over a year ago, but publication was delayed until recently due to a problem with the initial press run.

*Mishkan T'Filah* is not just a revision of the *Gates of Prayer*, the previous Reform prayer book; it is an innovative and intellectually satisfying volume.

Prayers are generally presented in a two-page format. On the right hand side, you will find the Hebrew text and transliteration, together with a more traditional English translation. There are also explanatory notations. On the left hand side, you will find more interpretive versions and commentary. The upper corner of each page indicates where in the service you are. These elements will provide Rabbi Mark a great platform from which to teach. Once the new siddur is received. Rabbi Mark will give a workshop to help the congregation make the transition. If you would like to see what a page of *Mishkan T'filah* looks like, you can go to http://uri.org/mishkan/. where a sample page is available. (You can also find an annotated sample page by going to http://urj.org/mishkan/introducing/ and scrolling down to "The Structure of MT:

<u>A Guided Tour through a Typical Two-Page Layout</u>") We obtained a copy of *Mishkan T'filah* to review prior to its adoption, and will try to have it available for you to review at the Temple.

It will take us a few months to obtain the new books, as the initial printing has sold out, and the second printing is in process. In the meantime, we will continue to introduce some of the various features of, and concepts behind, this prayer book for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. *Mishkan T'Filah* is a wonderful present for our Temple's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary.
