Rabbi Says:

One day last month, I found myself in a large mainstream bookstore. I picked up a book entitled," WORLD WAR II Album, The Complete Chronicle of the World's Greatest Conflict", edited by Hal Buell.

As I leafed through the book, I noticed that it made no mention of the Segregating

of our people or their persecution, in the ghettos, except the end of the Warsaw ghetto, the death camps, or the SS extermination groups. Nor was there any mention of the partisan movements, Jewish or otherwise. I found the major reference to Jews on pages 322-323 where it showed 4 pictures of the Warsaw Ghetto and these were of fellow Jews either surrendering or passively being led away.

It struck me first as being another case of a "complete" book being anything but, until I then realized the extent of the libel upon our people. This book was published in Italy originally, but was then translated into English and published in New York portraying the Fascists and Nazis as heroic and all others as either passive or cowardly.

This Pro-Nazism is so blatant that in the Preface section there is a special insert describing Nuremberg as the Spiritual Home of the National Socialist party. It further describes the activities of the Nazi party there without any mention of the Nuremberg Race Laws of 1935.

How could a book this blatantly racist make it to mainstream America you ask? Others like it will continue to bombard our young people as well as videos, my spaces and you tube features as long as we allow them to.

In the last few years the attendance at the Days of Remembrance here in Burbank has been dwindling. Where

once we more than filled St.

Judes. This year people were talking about our own sanctuary being more than able to accommodate the participants. Every fewer clergy make it their business to be with us. Every year we lose more young people to a program of speeches.

We must take all the Holocaust memorials, starting here and

continuing throughout our country and the world and "enliven" them. We must capture the souls of our young people so that they know what is at stake, nothing less than their spiritual and physical lives. For our people especially, we must teach our children that our people did not passively go into the gas chambers, a rumor started by NAZIS seeking to escape the Nuremberg War Crimes Tribunal. Next, we must remind those who feel Holocausts cannot happen to them that the first Holocaust of the 20th century was by Muslims upon Christians. I don't care how closely allied we are with a certain moderate Muslim nation.

They were guilty then and every year that they cover up, they do two things, one they make the Armenian Genocide an ongoing Holocaust. (The external flames may no longer be visible, but they have become the flames of neshamot burned from generation to generation. We know well how one group of people can seek to burn your soul with their lies, innuendoes, and persecutions and segregations. We need only think of the Blood Libels of the Middle Ages to be reminded of generations tainted and made fearful of living a normal life by their neighbors' curses) and they continue to curse their own souls with their sin of omission.

Next we must be ever vigilant in our daily lives to attack the Holocaust deniers wherever and whenever we see them. Complain to your local Anti-Defamation League Office or call me. We will pursue them diligently. Also, our support for the State of Israel must not waver. Israel can speak to governments as we cannot.

I may not return this book as I had first intended, only so I can show people how a text book bought from a local mainstream book store could be such an aberration on the truth. What I will do for sure is write a formal letter of complaint to the author and the publishing company in New York and wait for their response. I will keep you abreast of the news in later columns. B'ahava and b'shmirah.
