### Rabbi Says:

"Shimon HaTzaddik ... used to say,' The world rests on three things, Torah, righteous actions, and acts of loving kindness" (Pirke Avot 1:2)

A few weeks ago, I was in one of my haunts going through a bag of toys to join our temple's

donation to Children's Hospital, when a lady stopped me and asked me the price of another thrift shop item. I told her that I did not work at the thrift shop but was a customer, just like herself. She said, "But you look so serious and act so efficient". "That's just because I'm here so often, I know the drill", I thought to myself.

But instead I said to her, "We, at my Temple, Beth Emet in Burbank, have an on-going Tzadakah project, we collect new toys for Children's Hospital and then one of the members drives them there. At the hospital, they go through 500 toys a week." She then asked, "Can I contribute ?" I said, " Sure!" And went back to my searching for an X-Man figure. She then continued, " My name is M......G......,I recently had cancer and survived. Now I'd like to give something to the children who have cancer or who may just be very sick. Please take this". She handed me some money and I bought more toys.

As I left the thrift shop, I thought a lot about M.G.'s actions. Her questions, her request and then her actions. How did she know I was telling the truth about the toys going to Children's Hospital ? After all I didn't tell her I was a rabbi. And when I somewhat ignored her as I continued my search for the perfect super hero figurine, she encroached upon my space to share with me. And what a sharing !! Here was a

Dear friends and fellow temple members,

Cancer victim/survivor, who instead of pitying herself wanted to help others get well. Instead of pulling into herself and building a shell, she made herself vulnerable to a stranger in a thrift shop.

M.....G......showed me the path of Tzedakah, righteous behavior. Sometimes Tzedakah gets translated as money given. It's not. Tzedakah means doing the right thing, even if it leaves you vulnerable, feeling awkward or silly, or having to share a secret about your life. Tzedakah means caring more for others, INCLUDING strangers you have never met and will probably never meet, than you do for yourself.

Tzedakah means giving love, care and concern from the moment your eyes meet another's until they leave your life. Tzedakah is what we are to do. Tzedakah will heal us while we seek to heal others. Tzedakah is always a part of us. Let us pledge to do random acts of Tzedakah outside of our comfort zone. Let us do them even when we are nervous or scared or frightened. Let us do them with and for strangers and let us not be turned away by our own bitterness. Let us love unconditionally and act righteously.


