### Rabbi Says:

"For the Need of the Giver to Give and for the Needy to Receive",  
Rabbi William M. Kramer Z"L



A Temple member I respect asked me the other day about Tzedakah. He wanted to know if whenever someone came to my house and asked for "Tzedakah", I gave them some. I replied, "I did". He was amazed. I'm not. In our tradition, we are committed to act righteously, and that is what "Tzedakah" means. It is not the same as charity, which Microsoft Encarta Dictionary, copyright 2001, defines as, "the voluntary provision of money, materials or help to those in need".

Others may choose to do charity, we may not. The onus is upon us to help those in need. Unfortunately, in this super-charged world where people are over-worked, over-taxed, and over-stressed, we have defined "Tzedakah" in terms of money given. A gift of money, while one direction of Tzedakah, is not only not the only type of Tzedakah, it is not the highest level of Financial Tzedakah.

Maimonides, possibly the greatest of all the Medieval Judaic philosophers, rates Tzedakah as follows, from Mishneh Torah 10:7-14.: 'The highest level of Tzedakah, above which there is no other is to support a fellow Jew by endowing him with a substantial gift or loan or entering into partnership with him, or finding employment for him in order to strengthen his hand until he needs no others.'

# President's message

Dear friends and fellow temple members,

Once again, as we approach the High Holidays, it is time to reflect on the past year. As a temple, we have celebrated births, b'nai mitzvahs, weddings, and the lives of those who have departed from our midst. We have welcomed new members and said goodbye to old friends. We even held the Harvest Ball, the first large and very successful temple party/fundraiser in many years. Throughout this past year, we have built relationships for the future and accumulated memories of the past.

In many respects, it was a good year; yet in others it was difficult. A few weeks ago I lost a very close friend and mentor. Some of you may have known him. His name was Harry Diamond. Harry was the quintessential survivor. Throughout his entire life he encountered situations that would have defeated a less determined or creative individual. He grew up in Brooklyn during the Depression, surviving poverty and neighborhood gangsters. Captured at Casino by the Nazis during WW II, he was among only 44 survivors of the 840 men forced to march from Italy to Germany. In a German POW camp, he survived by relying on his wits and daring. In the following years, Harry continued to overcome personal and financial calamities. Despite the hardships he had faced, Harry always believed in helping others.

About 27 years ago, he met his soul mate, Judy. Together they had run a business selling toys to various organizations, including hospitals, schools, churches and temples. Recently, Harry told me how he enjoyed attending their events and seeing the excitement on children's faces.

Rashi, a further giant of Jewish philosophy commenting on Maimonides, teaches that, as Maimonides, levels of Tzedakah are all ascending; a loan is higher than a gift, a partnership is higher than a loan and the highest level of Tzedakah is to find employment for a person in need so that he 'needs no other'.

One of my professors at the University of Judaism, now the American Jewish University, once taught us that whenever two Hebrew words have two out of three root letters the same, there is a connection between the words. A good example of this is the Hebrew root for laughter, "Ts,H,Q", while the root for scream is "Ts,O,Q". This theory also holds for the Hebrew word Tzedakah, Tz,D,Q and the Hebrew word for need, Tzreka, Tz,R,Q. there is a connection between Tzreka and Tzedakah, need and righteous behavior. When there are people in need we must act righteously.

This month, as we begin a period of intense self-examination, let us remember when we have acted in support of, with, and helped secure sustenance for a person in need. Let us also remember, grievously, when we failed to do this. Let this year's Days of Awe afford us a time where our failings fill us with dread, only to be surpassed by our successes which are both AWESOME and AMAZING as we strive to fulfill the needs of our community.

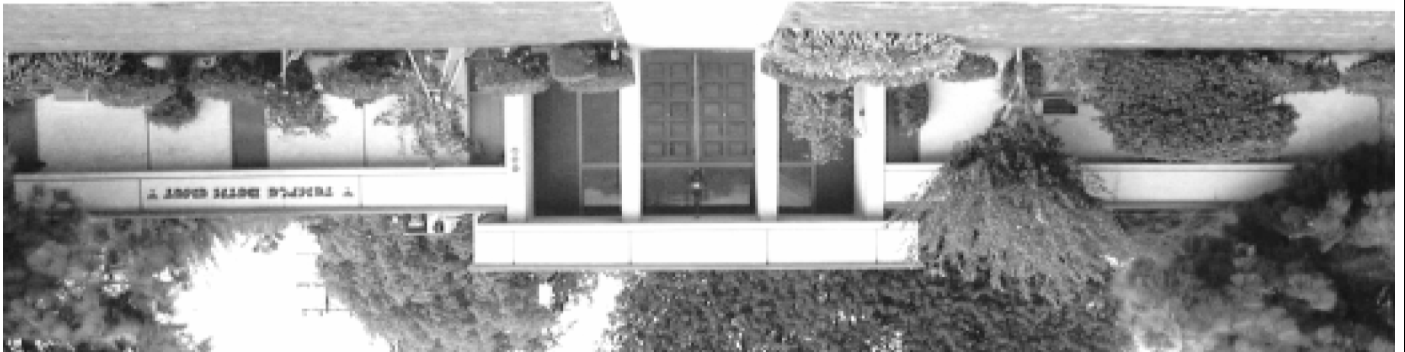
