Rabbi Says:

"Remember when you point your finger at someone else, three fingers point back at you," Anon.

It was a very difficult day. Our soccer team had lost to another team we had never lost to by the score of 7 to 1. One of my varsity players had basically told me that I was a lousy coach and should be fired. He said this because he did not like whom I had substituted into the game when we had needed to. This really hurt my feelings because I believe I was doing the best job possible given the situation. Then I went to Temple to help one of our Bar Mitzvahs prepare for his Torah reading. His Torah reading is the monologue by Moses where he asks G-d, "Why did you send me to free the Children of Israel?" It happens right after Pharaoh tells Moses that not only will he not free the Children of Israel, but he will take away the straw used by the Israelite slaves to make the bricks. So Moses goes out to the edge of camp and begins to yell at G-d. It made me think about my relationship with my soccer players. How many times have I tried to help them and instead of getting better it gets worse? How many times have we together found ourselves wondering what will happen next, after a disastrous defeat.

A scant few days ago we inaugurated President Barak Obama. One of his idols is President Abraham Lincoln. This month we celebrate Abraham Lincoln's 200th birthday on February 12th. I think of Lincoln's successes and his failures often. He was a man of humble origins who through hard work and study achieved the greatest office in the world. But through this life of success there were great failures. He succeeded and failed at several businesses, but he never gave up on his dream. He set goals and

President's message

Dear friends and fellow temple members,

Have you ever suspected you were in the midst of the Mad Hatter's tea party? Every time I read a newspaper or see a televised news report about the Middle East, I feel that I am peering "through the looking-glass." Right is wrong and wrong is right. According to the press recently, the Israelis have been struck by up to 200 rockets each day for the past eight years and have only now retaliated with significant force. Regardless, the press, through words and images, mostly of crying women and dead children, makes Israel out to be the aggressor. Does this make sense to you?

Imagine if our neighbors, either Mexico or Canada, shot rockets across the border into the United States. Imagine our reaction! In fact, when the U.S. was threatened simply by the presence of missiles in Cuba, we declared a crisis, blockaded Cuba, and nearly entered a nuclear war! It seems to me that every nation in the world has a right to defend itself – except Israel. The world expects Israel to accept the attacks but not respond. Does this make sense to you?

Hamas, whose avowed goal is to destroy Israel, deliberately launches rockets from homes, schools, hospitals and U.N. sites, into Israel. They know that retaliatory strikes target the sources of these rockets, thus placing their own women and children in grave danger. When Israel responds to these attacks, Israel is blamed for the loss of civilian life regardless of the fact that Hamas placed them in that danger. Does this make sense to you?

Quoting a lawyer who spoke at the infamous McCarthy hearings, I feel like demanding of the other countries of the world, "Have you no decency?" How can you let a group whose goal is to incite terror, a group that has no regard for human life, not even their own, claim to be the victims themselves? To legitimize this claim of being "victims" is to legitimize their actions and by extension, their goal of destroying Israel. Does this make sense to you?

made them happen. He believed in being in the right place at the right time. In other words be prepared for success. He worked hard at what he did. He persevered.

More importantly, Lincoln had rules to live by. The first is, live fearlessly. **DON'T BE AFRAID TO GO AND PLAN AND DO CORAGEOUS ACTS.** Be brave! Millions of people live lives of quiet desperation. Don't you owe it to yourself to go out and experience new ideas, new thoughts, and new plans? I love it when I come up with a substitute player who surprises everyone with his splendid play.

Second, Lincoln brushed off criticism. He did not take it to heart. He was once told that he was two faced. He, said, "If that was true, would I be using this one?" Third, Lincoln used laughter often. He knew a good quip could defuse any situation. Fourth, Lincoln was never afraid of adversity. I have won at least 50 Soccer matches and I have lost close to 20. In those 50, I am sure we won many because we rebounded from loss and turned it into victory. If we had been afraid of adversity we never would have accomplished as much as we have.

I'd like to add a personal note on how to absorb hard times. Find a friend, someone you can speak to on the deepest level and talk out your frustrations, your hopes and especially your dreams. Let that friend uncover the joy that is hidden beneath the spiritual scowl of hurt feelings. Let him or her draw you out and return you (tshuvah) to your normal state of optimism.

After my discussion with my friend, I had hoped to see the future as brighter. After reading Lincoln, I know it will be.

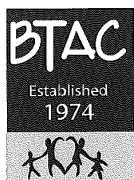

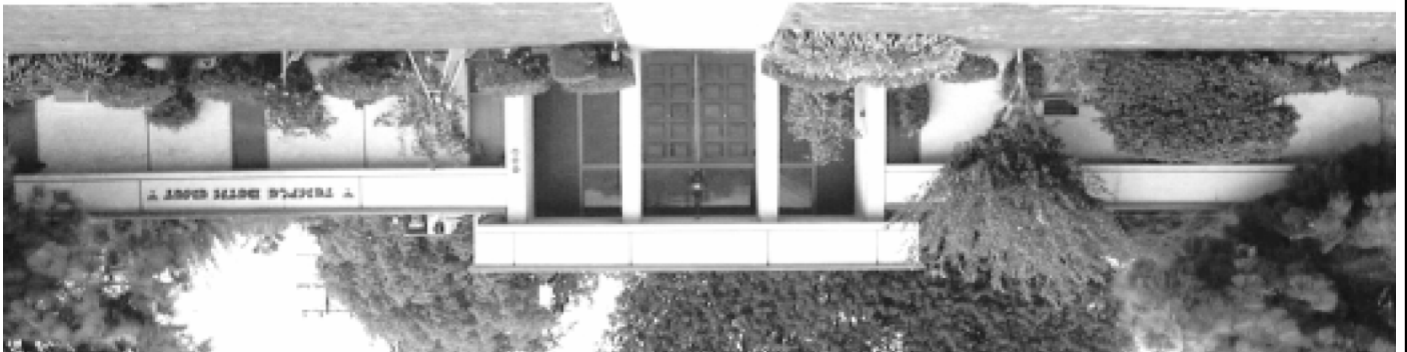
