### Rabbi Says:

"Kol Yisrael Achrai, zeh l'zeh"  
 (All Israel is responsible one for the next) Talmud Bavli

In a few days we will be celebrating Purim, the holiday where we commemorate being saved from annihilation through the gallant efforts of Mordehai and Esther. We will begin our celebration this year on March 7 with our school carnival where our children will dress up in costume, hear the Megillah reading and then enjoy themselves with games and contests and food. As they win tickets, which they invariably do, they amass prizes. All of this to help increase our joy in what we have and that we are here to appreciate our lives. The adults get to join with our children at the congregational Megillah reading on Monday night the 9<sup>th</sup> at 7:30PM. There the parents as well as the children get to dress up in costume, hear the Megillah being read, in many different languages, join in singing with the children's choir, boo Haman and eat Oznai Haman (Hamantaschen).

All of the above unusual Temple activities are actually part of Jewish Law, and almost all of us do at least one and maybe all on a regularly Purim basis. But there is another extremely important act of Halachah (Jewish Law) that we don't do. It is called Shlach Manot (sending a portion). Sending a portion means, gathering together some foodstuffs and maybe a small amount of money and taking it to someone who is in need of such a gift. The rules are quite clear, it is to involve cakes, sweets and other light food that can be eaten immediately. Now, you may ask if we are giving to someone in need, why not give more substantial food? We are after all Jews and Jewish cooks are famous for filling you up and then some.

# President's message

Dear friends and fellow temple members,

Once upon a time, not that long ago, our temple was graced with the presence of a lovely lady by the name of June Beck. Although not one of the founding members, she was indeed a pillar of our community. June gave freely of her time, her energy, and her wisdom. She is also instrumental in teaching us several lessons.

The first lesson involves the concentration of knowledge and thus power in one person. June knew it all, from temple finances to where to find the postage stamps. She was the repository of temple information, both major and minor and anyone who needed anything could get the answer from her. Only when we lost her, did we realize how much knowledge had died with her. We have spent years trying to reconstruct and regain all that we lost while also trying to move ahead with the times. The painful lesson is that knowledge is power and to sustain and grow an organization, the knowledge and power must be shared. Committees exist for this purpose. If we are to learn from our mistake, no one person should ever dictate the mission of a committee. Decision-making must be a shared process in order to operate appropriately. Allowing one person too much control is ultimately damaging to the community.

The second lesson involves the consequences of complacency when a community becomes too dependent on one person. Shortly after my son, Martin's Bar Mitzvah, I realized my discontentment with our lack of social programs for both post B'nai Mitzvah teens and single adults. Having decided to leave the temple, I mentioned my feelings to June who, in her wisdom, convinced me to speak to the Board of Directors. To make a long story short, I "put my money where my mouth was". As a result, I created and ran both an active

I believe there are several answers to this question, but I'll give you my two favorites. The second is that when you bring cold light snack food one to another you are available to be invited in. If there is no food to prepare, you and the recipient can join right in sharing. As we well know, when you share food you often share conversation then you share memories and ideas and maybe even common needs. To me shalach manot also has a bi-lingual pun inside of it. The word shalach in Hebrew means 'send' while manot means portion, but the word manos (Ashkenaz pronunciation) in Spanish means "hands". So when I give "Shalach Manos", I feel I am really giving a hand to someone who is in need. This is the spiritual side of shalach manot, to share with the person in need their needs and to help carry the burden with them. So, fellow Purim celebrants, Help bring a bit of sweetness in the midst of what is quickly becoming a time of bitterness. Saving lives takes on many different guises. Esther was in the right place at the right time. If ever one of us is in the right place at the right time 'to save' a life let us be confident that we "Shalach manot"ed someone and offered up a portion of help as we sent out our hands in assistance.

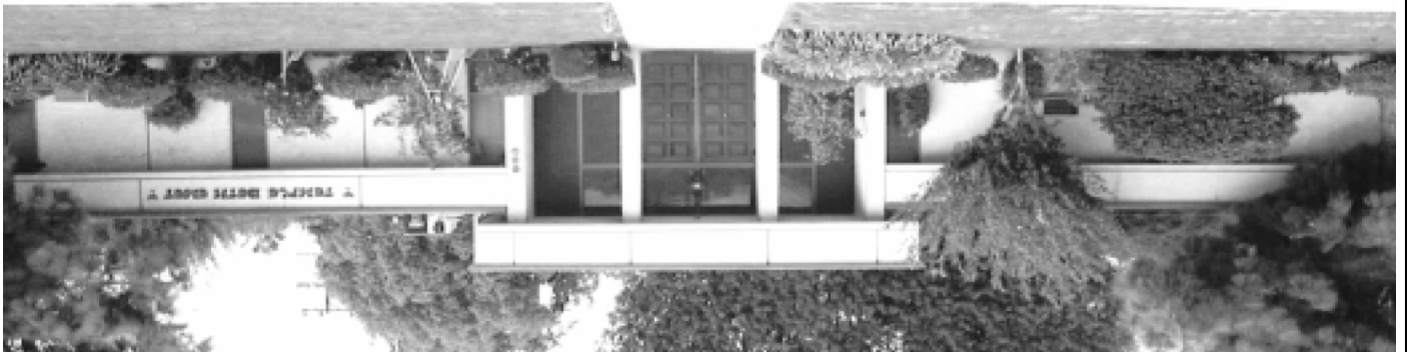
