#### Rabbi Says:

" One generation passes and another comes". (Ecclesiastes 1:4)

One of my activities as rabbi of the congregation is visiting the sick. And sometimes as I am traveling to the hospital or to a home I think how our



view of sickness and those who are ill has changed. Maybe it is because the natures of our diseases are different, cancer has replaced cholera, and cardio-vascular disease has replaced conjunctivitis (pink eye) and phlebitis the flu. These diseases are long term not brief in duration and may have long periods of rehabilitation or hospice care.

That is why I want to share with you a situation that presented itself to me last month. I decided quite suddenly to visit one of our members in the hospital. My other duties had ended in such a way that I had some free time to visit and because it was a terminal hospice situation, I took my prayer book with me to say "Vidui" (confession). (Yes there is a Jewish prayer of confession that can be uttered outside of Yom Kippur). So, fully 'armed', I rode up the elevator and upon arriving at the proper floor, started to walk down the hallway towards the room. Across from the room I was greeted by the daughter and son-in-law of the hospice patient, but in addition, the married grandchildren, the parents of the grandson-in-law, and the great grandson of our member. The family and I sat outside the room and chatted for a minute and then it was time for me to say my prayers. As I walked into the room, our temple member, who Iwas told was under a heavy morphine drip and comatose, was lying in bed with her eyes open looking intently at her great grandson. More importantly, he was talking to her. He was telling her. I believe, about his day and about how much

# President's message

In the days immediately following the earthquake in Haiti I was transfixed watching the coverage of the devastation and suffering in the heavily populated area of Port-au-Prince. Television, especially cable news, has made



this a very small world indeed and the impact of this tragedy was strongly felt. I watched as the correspondents described how an area that had practically nothing now had even that taken away. In the poorer areas of the city people had lived in houses built of concrete blocks, one literally on top of another. In an instant, the entire neighborhood — a slum really—toppled down on itself like dominos. All over the city buildings had collapsed. Rich and poor, churches, government buildings, businesses, all gone.

As I sat in my comfortable recliner watching the horror unfold on my color television in my intact home I was overcome with a feeling of helplessness. Here were people in great need of help and I was so far away and could do nothing. It was heartening to see Los Angeles County Search and Rescue teams mobilizing to fly off and help but I still felt the need to do something and not just be a spectator to the calamity. As the flood of relief efforts began to build I opened the web browser on the computer and went to the Red Cross website. I made a donation to the Haiti Relief and Development Fund. It wasn't a particularly large donation. Like many of us my family has been affected by the current economic situation. But after I had made the donation I felt a little better. I had done something.

expression on her face was truly priceless. Unfortunately, as I entered the room, the family said a hasty good-bye and let me do my blessings. In a matter of moments our friend had fallen back 'asleep' and I prayed alone.

I cannot stress enough how much the family visit and the baby's love meant not only to our friend but to the entire family. Their grief was tempered with the joy of family continuity. The past had traveled through the present to the future. Not only was this a time of endings but it became a time of beginnings. The infants hand now was physically linked to the matriarch's soul. An act of kindness and lack of fear, yes fear of death and the dying, gave life to all who witnessed it including myself. I have seen it myself, the new est generation because of its innocence and love brings us from the depths of our mourning at least to a level of acceptance that life is a continuum but more so to the heights of our eternity. I will always feel blessed that my grandfather took me with him to see his mother, my great-grand mother several times before she died when Iwas eleven. Iwill always remember when we kissed her she would say in Yiddish, "it is worth a million dollars to me". Oh no "Bubbe", it is worth far more to myself and my cousins for you are my connection with who I am and who my children are and will be.

Friends, when someone we love is seriously ill, don't fear! Bring yourself, bring your children, bring the grand children and the great grandchildren. For through these acts of loving kindness, your soul will be healing, yourself, as it heals others. And as we know, a healthy soul creates a healthy body.

Storms remind residents to pack 10 Essential Items to be prepared for emergencies

The 10 Essential Items, as recommended by the Emergency Survival Program in LA County's Office of Emergency Management, include:

1. Water

2. Food

3. Cash & Important Documents 4. Clothes

5. Flashlight

6. First Aid Kit

7. Medicine

8. Radio

9. Toiletries

10. Tools

These essential items will help ensure that people have access to basic essentials when other resources may not be available during an emergency. It is also vital that families put together a Communications Plan, such as a pre-planned place to meet and a designated out-of-state contact, in case family members are separated or at work or school when a disaster strikes.

In the days that have followed I have taken great pride in the response of nations and people all over the world to the plight of the people of Haiti. It has been satisfying to hear of the successes of teams from Los Angeles and Israel in saving lives, even though I know that for every rescue from a pile of rubble, there are many more people who will not be rescued and that many of the broken bodies will never heal. Relief efforts have not progressed with the speed or efficiency one might have intended, but the effort is continuing and will continue for a very long time.

My small donation will not repair the damage done by the earthquake in Haiti. I dare say no one person in the world has the capacity to rebuild what has been destroyed in that small nation. But that does not mean one should not do something. In *Pirkei Avot* (*Ethics of the Fathers*) Rabbi Tarfon teaches us "(i)t is not your part to finish the task, yet you are not free to desist from it."

If you have not already done so, and if you are able, please make some contribution to help the people of Haiti. You will feel better. I did.
