Rabbi Says:

**“ To Everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven”
(Book of Ecclesiastes)**



Last month two events occurred that may alter the nature of education at Temple Beth Emet for a long time, if not forever. Both are changes in use of our facility, both expand our educational opportunities and one is as bold as when the founding fathers began this Temple.

Early in May, we were approached by a non-profit acting school named Active Actors, who had lost their lease in Hollywood and needed a new location. Having studied at Active Actors, I knew the nature and the teaching style of their instructors and how they are positive in their critique of new and struggling actors, so I agreed to approach the Executive Board on their behalf. The Executive Board gave their consent pending approval of the Board and so the Active Actors Tigers moved in. As with any new relationship there were a few complexities to work out, but cool heads, a desire to compromise and genuine affection and respect for each other has led the actors, teachers and our congregants to work together and produce “productions” without anyone ‘making a scene’. I am especially proud of the people who stepped forward to greet Jackie, the director, not knowing she is a Temple member, introduce themselves and offer ways to integrate the school into Temple life. Volunteering seems to be the word of the day and that really enthruses me. Now the Temple hosts an evening school Mondays through Thursdays from 6pm to 8pm. If you are interested in a career in acting or just want to see how Hollywood practices, come and join us.

At that same Board meeting, the Temple Beth Emet Board of Directors approved the moving of our Religious School sessions from Saturday mornings to Sunday mornings. Several temple families worked very hard to see if there was enough support for such a move. When presented to the Board, there was great and vigorous discussion. What was not known at that time was that there had been discussions with our auxiliaries and under a frank and honest umbrella the leadership of the Temple sub-communities, while they had some concerns about usage and noise, agreed to support the move. So, effective on the second SUNDAY of the month of September 2010 we will begin classes from 9 AM to 12 noon.

What does this second change mean to all of us? As the world is getting more traditional, the afternoon Bar/Bat Mitzvah is getting less popular and the morning Torah Service has begun a renaissance. Also, while the congregation was started by some very non-traditional families seeking an alternative form of Judaism, the 2010 Temple Beth Emet congregant wants to live a 'traditional', albeit free Judaism and the move out of a Shabbat School to a Sunday School. On a more practical level, not having to compete with the vast array of children's sports being played on Saturdays for attendance at our school will be a pleasure for me.

But this change is not without its critics. A temple board member whom I respect a great deal spoke up during the Board meeting and said how sad she was that a Jewish Temple would be dark on Shabbat (day). Trust us, there are plans underway to use the Sanctuary for an adult class to prepare for their Bar/ Bat Mitzvahs, a Modern Hebrew Language class and even moving Adult Education to Shabbat afternoon so that those who cannot drive at night will be able to attend. Fellow Temple Beth Emet members, if you have other suggestions for what we can do judiciously with this newly 'opened' facility, let me know.

Many times in life we are faced with changes to our personal as well as professional lives. How we react to those changes show several things, (1) How satisfied we are in our current state, (2) How open to change we are and (3). How trusting we are of the people proposing the change. As I reflect on what I just wrote, it reminds me how busy those days in May were. I was meeting with several members of the Board, leaders of the Men's

Club, concerned parents and teachers, and each time I came away thinking about it. And even if there was not an embrace of ideas, because as we well know, change is, at least complex, at the most difficult, but not impossible. But our people kept saying, 'Let's try'. This is what I love about Temple Beth Emet, we are never negative to change. We may not agree with the change but we truly have a 'Let's try' attitude. More so, I am thankful every second of every minute of every day that the congregation has put its trust in me and they are not afraid to "go boldly where no one (from Temple Beth Emet) has ever gone before".
