The Temple With A Heart

With the High holidays approaching us, let's talk about cleansing. I know you're thinking this is going to be about inner cleaning, but, people who fast regularly will tell you that Yom Kippur 's fast could be seen as a cleansing of the body as well as the soul. This is where w

body as well as the soul. This is where we need to begin, cleaning our bodies as well as our souls.

Some months ago, we had a Bat Mitzvah and some of the invited guests kept Kosher. To enable them to feel more comfortable, the kitchen counters were all covered. After the Bat Mitzvah, the covers were removed and the counters went back to the way they were. Which in a word was 'unclean'. That is until a current board member took it upon them self, at the person's request they shall remain anonymous, and CLEANED the Temple kitchen. This act needs to be spoken of publicly because what was done was done without fanfare, without drama, and until I walked in, without rabbinical knowledge. More importantly, it was done out of love for Temple and for the congregation. We believe, truly, that a healthy neshama brings a healthy body. How much more so does a healthy body bring about a healthy soul? Judaism believes that the body is the vehicle for the soul. Most of us do not think twice about putting good gas in our automobiles or getting a car wash often enough to keep our vehicles looking nice. What about our bodies? The air we breathe is as important as the prayers we say for our well-being. G-d is the creator of all living things, some are good for us and some are not. The germs, which weaken our immune system, are living their lives as they should; unfortunately, our imbibing them is not living as we should.

# President's Message

The High Holidays are just days away and so I would like to take this opportunity to remember some of our past as well as embrace the future. It was from Recife on Sept. 7, 1654, that a group of 23 Dutch-speaking Sephardim set sail for New Amsterdam in a desperate effort to escape the Inquisition imposed by

Portugal, which had defeated Holland for control of Brazil. Shortly after arriving, these 23 immigrants - the first Jews to land on American shores established Shearith Israel, the first synagogue in New Amsterdam, the colony that eventually became New York.

Mussolini canceled civil rights of Italian Jews and expelled all foreignborn Jews in 1938.

The most infamous of the anti-Jewish legislation were the Nuremberg Laws, enacted on September 15, 1935. They formed the legal basis for the Jews' exclusion from German society and the progressively restrictive Jewish policies of the Germans. On September 19, 1940, the Nazis made all German Jews who were older than six wear a Star of David.

As Judaism teaches us, we shall forgive, but in order for history not to repeat, we shall never forget. Also as Judaism teaches us, get to know people for who they are, not a label. Embrace your fellow man. Have an open mind. Listen to all on what they have to say and be tolerant of others who don't believe as we do.

Despite all of our past, present and future hardships we shall continue to thrive, grow and make this world a better place because we will always stay true to our beliefs and nobody can ever take that away from us no matter how hard they try.

While we are looking at the air we breathe, we need to compliment those who have helped make the Los Angeles Basin cleaner, and to help those who cannot break the habit of smoking. Smoking is the symptom, not the cause of our bodies being weakened. Those who smoke need our help, not our criticism. We need to work together to find their stresses, such as: fear, anxiety and inferiority, that is causing people to smoke. Then we need to help find stress eradicators or, at least, moderators, to share with our loved ones so that they may help to change their ways and "rejewvenate" their bodies (I did that on purpose. Judaism believes that a healthy body and mind go hand in hand.)

Speaking of our bodies, Americans are becoming more and more obese as we speak. The secondary thing that this board member did for his/her self while cleaning was to exercise. I have been exercising as well. My family decided to have a family vard sale; sorry we missed the Temple one. I promise we'll make it to the next one. Anyway, I have moved "treasures" outside for eventual sale. I am not sure, but the air in my garage is lighter and cleaner after we disposed of some old paints and chemicals and seeds. Just rearranging and cleaning furniture and painting makes a difference in one's life, that can't necessarily be measured immediately, but will add years to one's life.
