

An old man was planting an olive tree seedling and another man of middle age said to him, "Why are you planting that olive tree, you will never see its fruit?" "Oh, no", the old man replied, "I am not planting it for myself but for the future of my children and my children's children to feed and nourish them." (a Tu B'Shevat fable)



This month we will celebrate two holidays which at once seem very different, but when we look further have a lot in common. On January 16, we will remember Martin Luther King. A short week later we will celebrate Tu B'Shevat, the New Year of the Trees. I grew up in the 60's when America was coming to grips with how it deals with its minorities. Most of us look at that period in terms of Black and White, Hispanic or Anglo. I look at it in terms of my Jew ish identity. My parents split up the Thursday after my Bar Mitzvah and in 1963 that was much more "unique" than today. In one short summer my safety net. my security blanket, my identity were shattered. Martin Luther King's Dream in August 1963 was different than mine, except in one area; he wanted his children to be free to know who they were, and I wanted to know who Iwas too. For the next two years, I searched for my identity from Leon Uris' Exodus to Gerald Frank's The Deed: I read all I could to find my identity, judaically and as a young American. I joined Young Judaea in 1965 and from the first meeting I found a family, and a second home. This new home was thousands of years old and 17 years young (they are both Israel, of course).

Parallel to my quest and discovery was the Civil Rights movement in our country. Many, many young people were finding themselves, who they were and who they dreamt of being. Young Judaea and its commitment not only to Israel but to Klal Yisrael (the entire Jewish nation), planted inside me the desire to be of service to our people, to all in need, and most importantly, to young people who are in search of their "Roots". This is why I am so passionate in support of our children's identification as part of our Temple family. I want our Home at Beth Emet to be their home, our family their family. I also understand that just as my Young Judaea experience planted the seeds of identity in my life, watered them through activities, academic and otherwise






