"The Commandments I give you shall be in your Heart." (Deut. 6:5-7)

Over the years, people have shared with me their interpretation of the terms 'Bar and Bat mitzvah'. In fact, the comic strip Tumbleweeds once had a comic devoted to it. Some have called it a glorified 13th birthday, some a Jewish rite of Passage, some a Manhood Ceremony (Tumbleweeds) and some have been honest enough to call it an affair with some religion thrown in. The definition of Bar or Bat Mitzvah (B'M) is "son or daughter of the Commandments." Of which commandments are they becoming offspring?" In certain Orthodox circles, the "commandments" would be the rituals of Judaism, because upon reaching Bar or Bat Mitzvah age, boy thirteen, girl twelve, the child no longer is a child in Judaism, but takes on the responsibilities of a Jewish adult. Counting in a minyan (a quorum of ten Jewish adults required for certain religious obligations) would be one important one.



An insightful quote comes to mind from former ritual chair, Jim Mattis, z'l, who used to present the Bar Mitzvah and Bat Mitzvah certificates to the honorees with the words, "This document allows you to be tried as an adult in a Jewish court." After the laughter subsided, we always realized he was right. Rabbi Kramer, z'l, would also add, "Remember Judaism doesn't believe in teenagers. You entered the building as a child, you leave as an adult." Of course Judaism believes in teenagers, we're just not so crazy about their "behaviors".

I digress. Which commandments are the Bar or Bat Mitzvahs "coming from"? Being personally responsible for performing mitzvot, not committing sins, now becomes part of the everyday life of the child. Prior to B'M age, the parents are held responsible for the activities of the child. Children are considered sin-free. Now, I am proud to report that our children are performing mitzvot long before they have to. A recent example comes to mind. One of our children was preparing for their B'M ceremony and a beloved relative was considered too ill to attend the B'M on the date prescribed. Speaking to the

parents, I suggested that we perform a “Chai” Mitzvah, a Rabbi Kramer term for a dress rehearsal, for that relative in the hospital. My only caution was that we clear it with the child. I should have known better. The child was not only agreeable, he was enthusiastic. The child met me when I arrived with a big smile of true joy. We gathered the family together in a rather small hospital room. From the first word of the first prayer to the conclusion, the prayers were chanted with correctness, harmony and, especially, Love.

It struck me then and has compelled me to think and rethink about the term, Bar and Bat Mitzvah. I think the young man in this case, as well as other Bar and Bat Mitzvahs, take their “Bar/Bat Mitzvahness” from one of the greatest of all commandments, “Honor your Father and your Mother”. More so, as in this example, they begin being Bar and Bat Mitzvahs long before their teenage years. So, maybe Judaism saw a deep cosmic secret a long time ago. If you treat a child as an adult and you give them adult decision making about themselves when they are the center of the activity, they will perform as adults and magnificently fulfill mitzvot, in their own unique and wonderful way. And truly isn't that a BIG, BIG mitzvah !!!!!
