
"Behold, children are a heritage of the Lord and the fruit of the womb." (Ps. 127:3).

During last month's FIFA World Cup Tournament, I received an email from TBE past–president Richard Emerson. It was titled, "Especially at the World Cup-pass it on," and it showed a picture of Lionel



Messi, the Argentinian star player lifting up his jersey to display a t-shirt showing the pictures of the three Israeli teenagers who were captured by terrorists. Below their pictures, it had the caption "Bring them home." When I first saw it, I couldn't wait to tell the congregation. In fact, I showed those attending Friday night services the photo and everyone was amazed at Messi's actions. The only comment lessening to the pure mitzvah of the action was the comment. "He's probably Jewish." He is not! He's Catholic. I know. I checked. And even more to the point, Argentina, while having a large Jewish population of Holocaust survivors, their children and grandchildren, is also the home to many Nazis, their children and grandchildren. In fact, in the 60's and 70's Jewish and neo-Nazi youths would fight in the streets of Buenos Aires with sticks, stones and even pistols. Alas, a few days later, the bodies of the 3 teenagers, Naftali, Ival, and Gilad, were found. And, in a fit of vengeance, a Palestinian young man, Mohammad, was kidnapped and murdered. As I pondered the loss of these young people, my thoughts went to the young Nigerian girls kidnapped and taken into the jungle, and then to the innocent young, victims of crimes here in the US. The Talmudic dictum, "when you take a life, you have destroyed worlds," came to mind. Lionel Messi's action at the World Cup gave me an idea. He brought the plight of three teenagers to the world stage. What can we do to bring the plight of all endangered children to the attention of the world? Let each of us light a candle every night in our homes.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - August 2014

Someone whose opinion I respect greatly, my wife Diane, suggested that I use the talk I gave at the Installation Shabbat as my column this month for those who were unable to attend. Because she usually turns out to be right, the following is an edited version of what you might have missed.

Noted motivational speaker Brian Tracy has written over 45 books and teaches courses on personal and organizational development. He has said that it takes 10 *greats* to make a great organization. Let's take stock of what we have here at Temple Beth Emet. Do we have 10 *greats*?

In no particular order whatsoever, we have a great Temple family, without that nothing else really matters; we have a great rabbi (Okay, so that is *not* in "no particular order," but if I put Rabbi Mark at the bottom of the list I'm sure I'll hear about it later); we have a great music director; we have a great lay cantor; we have a great newsletter, the Chai Times; we have a great religious school with a great Religious School Parents Association--that's a "two-fer;" we have both a great Sisterhood and Men's Club; we have a great youth group, our A.Z.A. boys, and we're looking to organize a new B.B.G. chapter; we are located in a great city, Burbank; and we have a great new Board of Directors, including I might add, a fairly respectable old Temple President. Maybe sometimes I'm great.

So you see, we have at least 10 *greats*. We have everything we need for success at Temple Beth Emet. But having everything we need for success does not guarantee success. We have to <u>use</u> all those great things. We have to put all those pieces together, and that takes <u>everyone</u> working to get everything to fit together.

When my son Jon was younger and we were on a Boy Scout overnight event, one boy had brought a large old-fashioned tent with lots of poles and no instructions. Modern tents practically set themselves up, but not this monster. All the pieces were there, but it took half a dozen adults hours to figure out how it all went together. They finally got the tent up but it took a long time. Sometimes it takes longer than you think to bring things together, and the same is true here at Temple Beth Emet.

That is the way it has been with our plans for a preschool, for example. Our initial work stalled for a while, but it is back on track. Organizing our library has taken a lot longer that we thought, but it's coming together. Getting our billing system to make sense is something we are still working on.

The thing is, different members of the Temple community directing their skills in different areas are getting things done. We can always use more help, more people with more skills. Sometimes an idea just has to wait for its time to succeed, like our Adult B'nei Mitzvah class, now with its second cohort.

Great things come from great ideas, and a lot of our great ideas come from the Temple community itself. If you have an idea for our next great thing, please make sure we know. We promise our first reaction will not be to dismiss the idea or say we tried that once and it didn't work. One of the worst reasons for not trying something is that it didn't work some time before. It's a natural reaction, but we've learned that some of the best things we do, like our community Seder, are things that didn't work out when we tried them before. We have to have the courage and creativity to try new things or rework older ideas; you never know what will turn out to be a great thing.
