

## "Her (His) value is far beyond rubies". -Proverbs Chapter 31

One morning last month, I was scanning the channels and I came upon Toy Story 3. The common themes of the Toy Story series were there: loyalty, bravery, animated toys and humor, but this time there was something unique about this number. In it

the toys are given away twice, the first time, anonymously, as a group of unnamed toys, that is, and the second time, each introduced by name and with a short story about each to a little girl known by Andy, their owner.

I am a participant in thrift shop sales, yard sales, estate sales, etc. My only regret when I make my purchases is that I don't know the history behind the object. Especially at estate sales, I don't know what the value of the object was to the person whose estate it was. I know what I paid in terms of brass and silver and gold, but the intrinsic or spiritual value of a religious object remains a mystery to me. "My mother loved this piece", could be a ploy on the part of the salesperson or not. I won't know. All I know is the piece looks interesting to me and the price is right.

On a basic level, we must tell the story of our "valuables" to our children and our grandchildren and, if blessed, to our great grandchildren and everyone else in between. Those toys were worth their weight in gold to Andy, if only because of the hours of valuable play time they gave him. So, valuables, doesn't mean silver, gold and fine china. It means history. Let me further explain. When Mina and I were engaged, my father sent us a Lenox Seder plate as a gift. During the 1994 earthquake it fell and broke. Mina and I were heartbroken, but interestingly enough, at a teachers' conference, one week later at Sinai Temple, I saw another. I bought it. Mina said, "But it's not the same". I said, "Physically, yes, but the story of this Seder plate adds to the family history. It is the Seder plate that was bought to replace the Seder plate that was sent by Pop for our engagement." We have used that plate many times and each

time it reminds us of my father, the 1994 earthquake and how blessed we are to have one and gone through the other.

In the Hebrew month of Elul, coming up in the middle of August and lasting until Rosh Hashanah, we are to examine ourselves to help us become better people. The word Elul itself has two Ls, in Hebrew, the letter Lamed, which almost always has to do with instruction, Lomad (learn) and mLamed (teach). Let us not only teach each other about our external valuables, but let us teach each other about our greatest valuable, ourselves.

When I heard about the trip, I wasn't about to let him go through the San Joaquin Valley in 100+ degree temperatures alone. 


