**“ Adonai, lay us down in peace**  
 (tranquility), raise us up for a life of  
 (fulfillment), and spread out above us  
**your Sukkah of Peace (completeness).”**  
 [Friday Evening Service]



We begin the month of October in the midst of Sukkoth, the Festival of Tabernacles (Booths). We end it with our neighbor’s holiday of All Hallows’ Eve (Halloween). Both have an aspect of death and rebirth in them. The prayer above says it all for us, “Let me lay down and rise up beneath a Sukkah of Peace.” In their belief system, All Hallows Eve is the night before All Saints Day, and is the last chance the Devil and his minions have a chance to take one’s soul before the whole world becomes holy under the umbrella of the Saints. (Righteous Christians, not football players). This time of year I try to envision what a Sukkah of Peace means and I think we can learn from our neighbors. The righteous behavior of those we come in contact with could and should rub off on us. Then we, in turn, will be able to help others build their own Sukkah of Shalom.

As we have learned before, Shalom means so much more than peace; it means completeness and fulfillment. Which, in turn, teaches us that if you feel complete, fulfilled and have achieved your potential that you will be “at peace” with yourself and with those around you. Now, we know how to build a Sukkoth Sukkah. We use branches, palm fronds, called Schoch, and then we hang fruit from the ceiling, and place pictures on the walls and leave one side open, or at least partially so. The roof is purposely not closed off, in order to allow both sunlight and moonlight to enter. At my home, we place tables and chairs and light so we can eat and sometimes sleep in the Sukkah. Now, how do we construct a Sukkoth Shalom? What things can bring us to completion and fulfillment? We begin by taking the “Shalomness” of others and make it a part of our Sukkah. For example, a Chaplain friend of mine, when asked how he was, would say, “I am blessed.” I don’t say it often enough, but I am learning to look at the blessings in my life more closely. And these blessings may be small in stature or drama or time, but they are blessings just the same. There is a picture in the hallway by our classrooms. In it one of our students is standing by a table top Sukkah. It is small in scale but not in detail, further, he did not

make it himself. He was helped and guided by his teachers. All of us are teachers to each other. Let us learn from one another. Let the fruits of each others' labors decorate the walls and the roofs of our Sukkat Shalom. Many of us have created "the fruit of our loins." How much we can harvest nourishment from them. As they grow to ripeness, may the scent of their maturity be a balm to us. In other words, gain peace from what they say, and if the words are not soothing, let us still take note that they can speak to us at all. The spiritual Sun and Moon are our visions of Heaven and Heavenliness. We, who have lost loved ones, can look to the Heavens in its Light and in its Darkness, have joy and sadness, and know that both of these emotions are part of Shalom. For completeness, fulfillment and, of course, Peace, does not come without pain and suffering. As we physically labor to build our Sukkah Sukkoth, with sweat, tears, sprains and pains, our Sukkat Shalom, is built with the same efforts. The only difference is, that those who are building and decorating it with us may not have a corporal presence, but their presence is all the same, just as real. That is why for us every day is All Tzaddiks (Saints) Day, and Satan and his minions, cannot take us, for we have built A Sukkat Shalom for ourselves, with our community and in honor of all the Tzaddikim who have been and are a part of our lives.
