"The Temple With A Heart"

**"In each generation everyone must see themselves as personally going out from the land of slavery."
(Passover Haggadah)**



The first Seder this year is on March 25 (the 15th of Nissan) and for most of us, that begins Passover, the Festival of Freedom. But one of the commentaries on the Haggadah has a very interesting insight, 'the festival of Pesach begins with the first of Nissan'. Why the disparity of dates? Biblically speaking, in the story of the outgoing from Egypt, Moses asks Pharaoh's permission to take the children of Israel out into the desert to celebrate the Spring Festival. Pharaoh refuses, G-d commands the sacrifice of lambs for the families to eat and spread the blood on the doorposts. The Angel of Death comes, kills the Egyptian first born and we leave. So maybe the Haggadah is referring to a long established pre-Exodus ceremony? Perhaps, but I don't think that is the only reason. These many years later our Passover holiday has replaced the ancient pre-freedom festival with a magnificent holiday festival of our own. Then, what is the significance of the two extra weeks of celebration?

To those of us who are neatness challenged we need as much time as we can get to prepare our homes for the party that is Seder. To me, the Seder is like the Bar/Bat Mitzvah ceremony. You have already fulfilled the requirements that we are commanded to perform and now you get to show off what you have accomplished. To further make the point, I have an uncle who best refers to the needed cleaning before Passover. He paraphrases a popular Passover song taken from a phrase in

the Haggadah, "Avadim Hayeenu, Ota B'nei Horeen" (We were slaves (in Egypt), now we are free people). My Uncle says, "Avadim Hayeenu, Ota Avadim M'chayeenu" (We were slaves (in Egypt), now we're still living as slaves).

While I agree with my Uncle about the physical magnitude of the cleaning needed for our festival of Freedom, I believe there is needed spiritual cleansing. Not necessarily like at Yom Kippur but with the end result being the same, Freedom. At Yom Kippur we ask G-d and other people to forgive us for our mistakes in order to be free of sin, at Passover we need to examine how G-d and other people enabled us to be free. Many people see freedom as synonymous with individuality. I think that is only one part of freedom. One must be free in order to discover who he/she is, but how can you be free to be yourself if you don't have anyone supporting your uniqueness.

I remember the quote by Albert Einstein, "Great Spirits always elicit violent reactions from mediocre minds". While Albert Einstein was an extremely unique individual, if he did not have Princeton University to support him, both personally and professionally, he might not have been able to pursue life as the great spirit he was.

Closer to home, if you do not feel loved and cared for can you truly express yourself in the manner you want? Of course, you cannot.

So, now I think I have found the reason for the extra two weeks of Passover before the actual Seder and celebration. Just as the joy of Shabbat cannot be complete if we wait for Friday afternoon to prepare for the Sabbath, here too, we need spiritual prep time.

Exercise your Freedom Ruah (spirit). Contact the people who make you feel spiritually free, your friends, your significant others, your parents, your children, your co-workers. Thank them. Invite them to join you for Passover or for any other time. Do as they did at the first Seder, share food and drink and prepare to leave your slavery for freedom. These people are your human mezuzot because through their actions in supporting, caring and caressing your spirit, they are doing the prayer of the mezuzah, "V'ahavta et Adonai Eloheika". They are loving G-d and by extension, of course, loving you. What greater love is there than enabling another person to become free? And after you have done all this, then you will be able to say, 'we were slaves, but now (sitting and talking with you) we are the children of freedom'. May we all be free to feel free together!

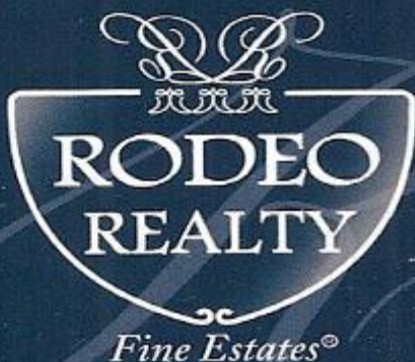
