

"And May their memory be a blessing forever" (Greeting to a mourner)

At the end of this month we will be commemorating those who have given their lives for our country. As a historian, I know that there have been Jews fighting and dying for the territory of America, even before there even was an America.

In fact, one of the first requests the new Jewish settlers of New Amsterdam had of Governor Peter Stuyvesant was that they be allowed to join the militia defending the city. He refused, but his bosses at the Dutch West India Company overruled him and the small band of Jewish men took their rightful places on the walls overlooking the Hudson River. There have been Jewish men fighting in every conflict on the North American continent since and wherever American forces have traveled. Many have given up their lives for our nation. Commodore Uriah P. Levy was proud to be an American and a Jew when he wrote in 1857:

"My parents were Israelites and I was nurtured in the faith of my ancestors. In deciding to adhere to it, I have but exercised a right, guaranteed to one by the constitution of my native state (New York) and of the United States- a right given to all men by their Maker-a right more precious to each of us than life itself... Remembering always that the great mass of my fellow citizens were Christians, profoundly grateful to the Christian founders of our Republic, for their justice and liberality, to my long persecuted race, I have earnestly endeavored, in all places and circumstances, to act up to the wise and tolerant spirit of our political institutions." (Jewish Folklore, Einhorn page 69)

To me, Uriah Levy's words reflect an attitude we all have or should have towards our country. When no one else wanted us, 1857 is 90 years before the establishment of the State of Israel, the United States offered us a home. A place where we could pray, learn, live and pursue happiness.

But the price we have paid in almost 400 years of warfare has been steep. We have been there for every conflict.

Rabbi Says: (Continued from Page 1)

We have been needed to defend our homes and our neighborhoods and by extension our country. From the Alamo to Zanzibar, from Baghdad to Burma, our young people have served. But we have not forgotten one thing, that armed conflict is not an end in itself. Other peoples may see glory in death and the evil that is war, but please remember, we, the Jewish nation, only fight to defend what is ours. In the Jewish Prayer book issued to Jewish servicemen and women during World War II, there is a unique paragraph added onto the prayer El Molei Rahamim, the Memorial Prayer for the Departed. It says:

"And the work of Righteousness shall be Peace... 'Nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war anymore. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all flesh shall see it together." [(Isaiah 2) Prayer book for Jews in the Armed Forces, 1943, page 312]

Some may ask, was the sacrifice of our young people worth it? I believe it was as long as our country remains a safe haven for those who believe in "Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness" for all and that war should only be waged to gain Peace, then their sacrifice shall not be in vain. We must honor their memory by listening to, reading about and researching their stories.

This year I will be telling about my friend Ricky Gilchrist who was killed in Vietnam and about Colonel David "Mickey" Marcus who was killed in Israel on the eve of the first Arab-Israeli cease fire. By telling and retelling their stories, our loved ones will never die, only their bodies will have left us. B'ahava v'Zikaronai hem I'bracha, Rabbi Mark
