"And Israel said to Joseph, I had not thought to see your face; and G-d has shown me your seed."

(Genesis 48)

On June 16th this year, America will celebrate Father's Day. In our Temple family, this will be a momentous occasion. Our Rabbi, me, will be a grandfather for the first time and our former teacher, my son Ezra, you knew him as Shahriyar, will be a father for the first time also. This phenomenon floods my thoughts on several levels, each one important to share with you.

Ezra came into my life, when he was 10 years old. Mina and he fled the Iranian revolution when he was 2. His DNA-father came to the USA later and Mina was divorced from him by the time we met. I would like to say that Ezra and my relationship was nirvana from the time we met, but bringing a pre-teen into your life when you are a bachelor, and then almost immediately adding a baby to this newly formed family, causes problems that are hard on everyone. Add to that that all four of us are first borns, means four dominant personalities are sitting at the dinner table together. It was hard. But, I am proud to say, Mina and I never made a difference between the two boys.

I remember being at a function and standing in line with the boys and behind us was an acquaintance. He knew Ezra's DNA-father. But he did not know the boys personally. I introduced them, Joshua first and then Ezra. He said, "Joshua is your son and "Shari" (Ezra) is your step-son!" I responded, "Around our house, we only use the word step when we are climbing up or down". The man then walked away. I still remember the smile on the boys' faces. But, truly, was there any other answer? I don't think so.

In April, I led the longest funeral ever. The comments in honor of the departed lasted for 2 ½ hours, at least 2 hours was taken up by children and grandchildren. The most important

I believe that trust is built on several factors. Familiarity is one of them. In time, you get to know a person's habits and perspectives. Trust is also based on punctuality. Being where you are expected to be, at the time you are expected, fosters trust based on dependability. Trust is also built on competence. Whatever the task, albeit work related, or chores around the house, can the person get it done, and done right? It is comforting to know the tasks[s] are in capable hands. As for communication and interaction, if a person cannot look in your eyes, are they hiding something? Or could it be that the person was hurt by someone? There are people for whom shyness is a characteristic. To determine what the cause of the avoidance is, you must take time to get to know the person.



How do you know if someone is loyal? Being loyal is being committed to a person or an organization. That means, giving 100%. Sometimes, insecurity can get in the way. Often, the causes of failing to establish a loyal relationship are irrational thoughts. In order to conquer and succeed in establishing a loyal aspect in our relationships, we need to base our thoughts on facts. It can be difficult to take the emotion out of our estimation of others' temperaments or perspectives, but we need to be reasonable and open to others' viewpoints. Give yourself time to know the dynamics of others and to understand what motivates them. There is also brand loyalty. We have that here at TBE.

In order for a relationship to work, compromise is often necessary. If you do not accommodate others' needs, your relationships will likely suffer or even fail. For the past several months, BTEE and Temple Beth Emet have been conferring about a possible joint congregation. At this juncture, we agreed to continue to collaborate on events for the Jewish community here in Burbank, that is all. We will not have any other discussions regarding merging on the table. We cannot come together on a couple core issues. We agree to respect each other's differences and "agree to disagree."

I want to thank all of the Board members, Rabbi, support staff and volunteers on all that you have done and accomplished over the past year. I appreciate all of your hard work, patience and dedication towards the Temple. Without our wonderful supportive people, the Temple would have nothing. You are valued and appreciated, each and every one of you.

I leave you with one thought; believe in the good in others.

part of this was that only a small number of those people were related by blood to the departed. I constantly see the magnitude of their mitzvot because a few months ago, I did two funerals in the same month where blood relatives had not spoken to the departed for years. It went beyond hurt and insult to a level I cannot even fathom.

I am blessed. After my parents divorced, they remarried people who took an active part in our lives and in the lives of my parents' parents. It wasn't without disagreements, after all these were Jewish families, but communication was the key. They spoke, they laughed, they argued. They disagreed. In other words, they loved. Now, I guess I have a different perspective than many people and even my former self. That is because now I am a grandpa, in Hebrew, Sava. It is from the same root as the word "L'histovav" which means to go around. So you can say grandparents give you good perspective because 'they've been around the block'.

So here's my perspective on parents who enter your life. Some share DNA with you, some share a house with you, some share a classroom with you, 'in loco parentis' (It doesn't mean that your teachers are like crazy parents, except maybe that they are crazy about you), all share a part of your life with you. Therefore, you must share with them. I know of no one who wants to be kept out of the life of one's 'child'. Therefore, this father's day and next mother's day and everyday in between, call, write, email or just go to where they are and communicate with those who have given you parental love. Let them know that their acts have helped make you the person you are. If you have no one to love like a parent, call me. I know plenty of 'grandparents' just waiting to love 'grandchildren' just like you.



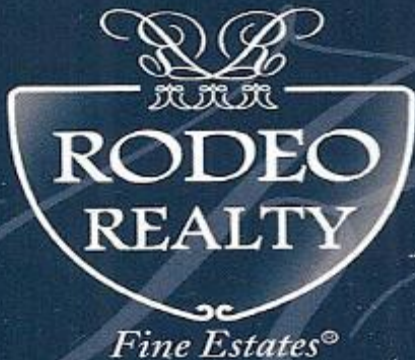

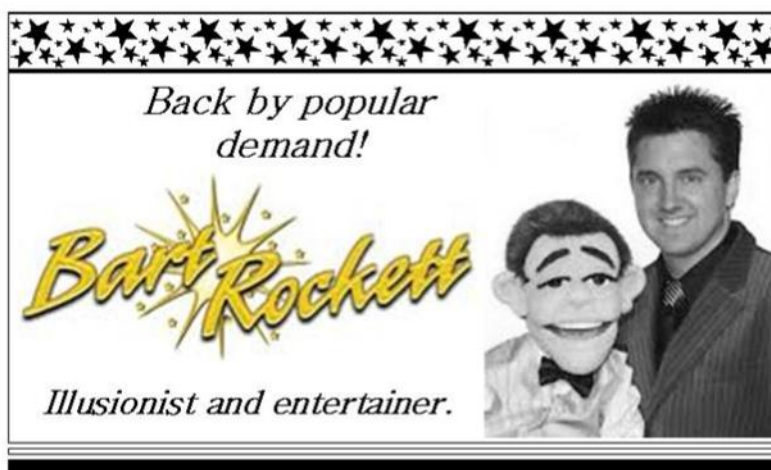
