A temple board member, whom I respect, asked that I put together my vision for Temple Beth Emet in the next 5 years. I see a temple where learning is a full lifetime experience. I want us to expand



on the nucleus we have in our religious school. If you were blessed enough to see and hear the Confirmation class and especially Allison Abrams and Rachil Barlow, you would agree that the young people at our school are truly remarkable. I want to expand the ages of our schoolchildren from the current 4 years 9 months to 15 years of age to a school that begins with Mommy and Me classes and ends with adults in their 60's, 70's or beyond. I envision our Temple becoming one where it is common knowledge that all are welcome to join us. We need to increase our out- reach to the Special Needs community. Long before it was the law, our building was built with no steps to enable all physically challenged people to be able to enter our building and to pray and play. It's time to expand physically and spiritually for these often shunted members of our community. Another group overlooked by many congregations is the military community. Just down the road from Fry's is the Burbank National Guard armory. I know because I was there. We need to invite service men and women who either live in Burbank or are visiting to come to our services. We have had several temple members and their children serve our country. The least we could do is to invite these young people serving currently into our synagogue and into our homes for a meal or an evening, or even all of Shabbat. At the other end of the traveling spectrum, we need to

go to the retirement and convalescent homes in Burbank and provide religious services for those who cannot join us at temple. In the past, we have visited some of these "homes," with our school children, leading songs and performing Purim plays and just being with people who need to know they are cared about. Coming home from our travels, we will call the post-confirmation adult classes, The Temple Beth Emet Open University, as it will be open to all. Its classes will be taught by Temple members. Many have unique educations, careers or life style situations. Let us find subjects they want to share with the congregation. We have doctors, lawyers, nurses, teachers, musicians, craftsman and a Rabbi in our community. The subjects will not be limited to Judaica, but will be chosen based upon the congregation's desires. On the subject of knowledge, we have Temple members who have never had a Bar/ Bat Mitzvah. I want to expand the Adult Bar/Bat Mitzvah program to include more classes, more people learning about Judaism and getting in touch with their roots. For those seeking Jewish roots, I want our Temple to be a place where people find, as Rabbi Kramer would put it, a portal into Judaism. For those not seeking the academic side of Judaism, but the social, I wish to expand the youth group. Let the program not consist only of weekly meetings, but monthly socials, sponsored by the temple. In this manner the youth group has the tool to expand its size the old fashioned way, person-to-person. Then when each has a wonderful time, both invite friends to be in we are so inclusive and because we adhere to the our youth group.

I see a temple where college-age kids come together to have social and religious experiences, where temple is a place not only for worship, but for Israeli dancing, or for late Friday night coffee or for conversation about how to save the world, spiritually. On a physical plane, I see a Temple that takes learning into the 21st century with new computers for the lab, streaming of all Shabbat and High Holy Day Services and a weekly pod cast, done either at my home or in my temple study, every week before Shabbat, answering questions from listeners and speaking about the relevance of Judaism in today's world. I see a Temple where learning isn't limited to Sunday mornings or week day evenings. I see a forum for discussion held every week at lunch time where people can sit and talk with the Rabbi and/or other congregants, on topics that are timely and important. I see the Temple's library being a resource to help *all* the students in Burbank, not just our congregation. I see temple members taking advantage of the Active Actors School and pursuing a dream to appear in the theater. I envision the Temple becoming a true "beit haknesset" (house of entry), where all can come to share ideas, strategies and knowledge, for the good of the congregation and our nations.

Too long have we kept our uniqueness a secret. We started out as a bit of an anti-establishment congregation, but now people are joining us because (Continued on page 5)

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - July 2013

How do I keep getting myself into this?

At the annual membership meeting last month our Temple President Steve Abrams announced that after three years of service and much deep reflection he decided not to stand for another term. I was nominated, agreed to serve, and was elected. Thus begins my third tenure as President.



Our outgoing President had done an extraordinary job. I have been proud to have him represent Temple Beth Emet and I am proud to call him my friend. I'm even proud to save Coca-Cola bottle caps for him to collect the points. This Temple owes Steve Abrams a great debt of gratitude for his creativity, the confidence shown in his board, his steady administration, and his dedication to Temple Beth Emet.

As many of you know, over the past year or so there have been exploratory discussions with Burbank Temple Emanu El regarding the possibility of combining to form a new congregation so as to strengthen our local Jewish community. At the outset we recognized the fundamental differences between us. We hoped that after we got to know each other at joint activities, and after self-examination by each congregation, we would find a way to reconcile those differences. In the end, those differences remained. They could not see leaving the Conservative movement; we cannot abandon our more inclusive beliefs or our Rabbi. There will be no combination, period. But we are still neighbors and we are both Jewish organizations. We can and should be on friendly terms, join in activities, and stand together as the Burbank Jewish community.

Why did we start the discussion in the first place? The answer is simple, and I've spoken of it every year at Kol Nidre -- money and membership. Neither congregation has enough. We had hoped that a combined congregation would be a stronger congregation, but we each had different visions of what that congregation would look like.

Since there will be no combined congregation, it is up to us to address and assure our future. While we need to grow our membership, that is not our most pressing problem. If fact our membership has been pretty stable and we continue to attract new and diverse families. The problem is money. The response to our recent dues adjustment has been very positive. We are grateful for your acceptance of the need for this adjustment, your expressions of support, and your additional donations. We need to build upon this renewed commitment. Perhaps we had not been asking hard enough or loud enough before. Ghandi said, "If you don't ask you don't get." We are going to continue to ask you for three things -- wisdom, wampum, or work. If you can't give one, give one of the others -- or two of the others. If you can give all three that is even better.

With everyone's wisdom, wampum, and work, just think of the Temple Beth Emet we can build. Come on, it'll be fun!

I envision us expanding our G-d and angel talk with people to include the home and the work place. I see us "renewing" our Judaism, as is said in the Yom Kippur Mahzor, "Hadesh Yameinu K'Kedem" (Bring newness to our days, as they were long ago). Often people ask me about our congregation. I tell them we have three types of congregants, Jews by birth, Jews by choice, and those who aren't Jewish and have no desire to become Jewish, but just like the way we approach G-d. And how is that you ask ? With joy, laughter and the full acceptance of those who take the road with us. Now this may sound terribly new and 21st century, but remember our Torah speaks of the stranger in our midst, who is to celebrate with us, participate with us and reach completeness with us. All that we ask is that they, "do justly," be just with each other, (no one knows all of Judaism, so no one has the right to penalize or tell someone else their view of Judaism is incorrect. It's just different. And *vive la difference*!) Love loving mercy, (be kind to each other, we are all created in G-d's image, so each of us has his or her own vision of G-d's universe), and walk humbly with your G-d. (Appreciate this world we live in with its billions, no, *trillions*, of unique entities and the unique manner that all are created, from the silent stone to the high C note above high C, all are one of a kind creations. As Judaism teaches me, faith without actions is not enough.

Additionally, I want to do outreach to the Burbank community. Not just at the Town Center Mall at Hanukkah or at Burbank on Parade, but going door-to-door asking people, "Have you found G-d yet?" You can help me do this. Make my vision for our Temple come true. Let Victoria or Sylvia know and we will work together. I don't know how many people in Burbank will heed our message, but I am willing to give it a try. Walk with me, talk with me. As Rabbi Nahman of Bratslov said, "The world is a narrow bridge, but the important thing is not to be afraid (to walk across it)." Walk with me through Burbank and let us not be afraid, for our community, for our Temple, and for ourselves; and let us, like the children of Scripture, see visions.




