"Your good mother tells me you are feeling very badly in your new situation. Allow me to assure you it is a perfect certainty that you will, very soon, feel better -- quite happy -- if you only stick to the resolution you have taken... On the contrary, if you falter, and give up, you will lose the power of keeping any resolution, and will regret it all your life." (Abraham Lincoln, 1862)



Ever just not love somebody? You know, there's just something about them that just makes you hate them? Whatever they do they seem to get under your skin? I am sorry to say that, but even some members of the Temple cause me to work hard to show them love. I do it and afterward I am very pleased, but unfortunately, sometimes I make mistakes. So now let me say it, with respects to Robert Burns, "Tis better to love all, then for a moment not to have loved at all." The Kabbalists say that those who we immediately have a love or a dislike for are people who we have shared a past life with. Gilgul Nefesh is the concept in Judaism and it makes sense to me. (We will be discussing Judaism and Reincarnation more deeply in class on February 11, at 7PM). But, some people have other ideas about this. The Ba'al Shem Toy, the founder of Hasidism, says the people who upset you the most are usually those who remind you of yourself and your faults. Perhaps this is why teachers and parents are often hardest on the ones, who, given a period of self-examination, they feel the closest to and of whom they have the greatest expectations. They remind us of ourselves, when we were their age. Also, those who are the most similar to us know our weaknesses, because it is their weakness as well. This is an interesting take on the sentence in Leviticus: 19 that states, "You will love your neighbor as you [love] yourself," for truly who is your closest neighbor more than the one who stands (acts) closest to you. Also, the Hebrew for neighbor" (raeka) can be translated as shepherd or evil. The sentence then goes in two B'ahava, especially this month,

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE – February 2014

When I was in college, during the late 1970s, California was suffering from a serious drought. In 1977, a Drought Emergency Task Force was created by the governor, Jerry Brown. In response to the situation, people were asked to reduce water usage by restricting the watering of landscape, taking shorter showers (or employing a rinse-soap up-rinse off method) and putting bricks in the tanks of their toilets. (This doesn't work, by the way.) We learned to turn



the water off while we shaved or brushed our teeth. Eventually we experienced wetter years and the drought faded from memory. Until the next dry spell. We have started requiring low-flow faucets and shower heads and toilets that use a little more than a gallon of water at a time rather than 5 or more, but most of us have gone back to nice long showers and green, green lawns.

Last month the governor, the same Jerry Brown, declared a drought emergency in California amid the driest year in the 153 year history of our state. We live in an area that suffers from a recurring lack of rainfall and droughts have occurred often. This year is particularly bad. January and February are supposed to be the wettest months in California, yet January was a complete bust.

In ancient Israel, rain was also vital for survival. Our liturgy contains prayers for the proper amount of rain at the proper time, most notably at *Shmini Atzeret*, the last day of *Sukkot*, when the elaborate and beautiful prayer *Geshem* is recited. From late autumn until Passover the *Amidah* is changed to include a prayer for rain: "Bless upon us, O Eternal our God, this year and all kinds of its produce for goodness, and bestow dew and rain for blessing on all the face of the earth." This appears in our own siddur in an edited form.

California's economy depends greatly of sufficient water to support our metropolitan areas and perhaps more so our agriculture. The current drought threatens the economy of our state just as it is recovering from a deep and sustained recession. The procurement and distribution of water have always been serious problems here, and this year the problem has become critical.

In Morocco recently, the King asked both Jews and Muslims to pray for rain as that country suffers though extended drought. Perhaps it is time for us, the Jews in California, to pray for rain, as well. Even those of us who may tend to the atheistic, agnostic, or rationalistic can pray for rain – it wouldn't hurt!

Here at Temple Beth Emet, we changed all our faucets to low-flow aerators in accordance with the City of Burbank directive a few years ago. Until our prayers are answered, the rains return, and the Sierras recover their snowpack, we should remember the practical tips we learned in the 1970s -- shorten those showers, water the garden less, and don't let the water run while shaving or brushing your teeth.

directions, "You will love the one who takes care of you as you [love] yourself" or "You will love your evilness, as you [love] yourself." Modern Hebrew makes "taking care of" into an axiom meaning, to really put someone in their place. When we are too arrogant, too full of ourselves, how many times has someone "shepherded us into our place?" And now, what about our evil? We all consider the goals we did not reach in our lives as failings and failure, as we are taught, is evil. All Jewish children are obligated to exceed their parents' expectations. And so, we ALL, have failed sometime or another. There are those who feel Abraham Lincoln did not only have a name in common with other Jewish children, may also have had a DNA tie, but that mystery may never be solved. There is one thing about him that I am certain. He never gave up. He failed many times, in business, in politics, in romance; this is February after all, but he rose out of his sadness and depression to become, arguably, the greatest President in the history of our country. He knew his "evils" and embraced them. He knew that they were a part of who he was and he taught himself to love who he was.

So, this month when we examine love, *true love*, not infatuation or lust, but love of self and of others; let us love those who are most like us and the parts of us that we love the least and understand that **both** need love, understanding and Valentines.


