"Be not afraid, ye beasts of the field; for the pastures of the wilderness do spring, for the tree bears its fruit, the fig-tree and the vine do yield their strength." (Yoel 2:22)



One day last month, I received a very sad email. A friend, Jack M., had died rather suddenly after

successful surgery. The funeral was to take place in two days and I made plans to attend. I got there at a reasonable time and was shocked to see so many people there. I usually park in the clergy spot, but I was there as a friend and not as an officiate, so I thought I would park in the lot next to the chapel. I ended up parking about a quarter of a mile down the road. As I walked up to the chapel, I saw people from SOCES (the Sherman Oaks Center for Enriched Studies). That was not surprising, because my friend had been a substitute administrator at SOCES (between the time an administrator transfers of gets transferred there usually is an interim period, so retired administrators are called in to cover the position). He was that rarity, though an administrator who teachers made room for at their table to invite him to join the conversation. After the service, as I walked toward the front of the chapel, I saw more SOCES people, but what surprised me was that some of my Patrick Henry and Lokrantz compatriots were also there. Now agreed, the deceased was a man who had spent his adult lifetime working for the LAUSD, but I didn't think I would have so many friends in common with him. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE – January 2014

A new year calls for a new beginning. At the last meeting of your Board of Directors we decided to take the first steps toward something we have talked about many years ago and have been studying again for many months: the establishment of a preschool at Temple Beth Emet. One of our members is experienced in the management of Montessori schools



and brought us a proposal. We have reviewed the business plan and, while there are still many particulars to be worked out, we believe that a preschool will offer us the opportunity to have an additional and much needed income stream, as well as to attract young families whose children will grow up in our congregation.

Montessori schools are characterized by a respect for children's natural social, physical, and psychological development. These values are consistent with those held by members of our Temple Beth Emet family. A successful preschool at a temple naturally leads to an increase in membership. Shortly after Burbank Temple Emanu El brought in a new preschool director, several preschool families began learning more about that temple resulting in several new members.

The need for additional preschool facilities in the local area is well known. Our location is close to major employers in Burbank, such as the studios, health care providers, and the major office developments. This will be attractive not only to those who live in the area, but those who commute, as well.

A preschool will require some building renovation as well as capital investment in equipment. By limiting the initial enrollment of the school, we will be limiting the extent to which we need to renovate. As the preschool grows, it will justify additional building improvements. We will also have to establish procedures to assure that the preschool, religious school, and the rest of the temple family can share the facilities, interact, and grow closer. These challenges will require creativity, understanding, and commitment from the entire Temple Beth Emet family, but those are the very characteristics of our TBE community.

As we move forward we will be reaching out to both the TBE and the local communities for assistance in this new venture. We not only need financial assistance, but the contribution of material and labor. Whatever we do not have to buy and whatever services we do not have to hire is less money we have to spend. This concept, of course, applies to the rest of our temple operation, as well! For example, we are in need of a good copier/printer for the office, repairs to some lighting fixtures, refinishing of the sukkah structure, and other general maintenance.

Your Board of Directors is mindful that the decision to start a preschool is a significant commitment. We believe that a preschool is a good way – perhaps the only way – to address our chronic need to increase our income and attract more new families. Right now we have only committed to beginning the permitting and licensing requirements. That will take many months, but we hope that the President's Message for January 2015 will reflect on the successful launch of the Temple Beth Emet Montessori School.

I knew Jack as being very much into his Judaism, so the closeness with a 'fine Catholic boy' surprised me. *My* character flaw not his.

Later in the day, a friend of mine from Lokrantz, and I do mean *friend*, a retired administrator, who I had not seen for three years since she retired, and whom I respect dearly, was the go-to person who helped me many times while I was at Lokrantz, and I had a chance to talk about a matter not related to the funeral or Judaism, but the education of a special needs person. The advice she gave me I will share with the parent of the child and we will see that he gets the educational services he is entitled to.

All of these things brings me to Tu B'shvat, Jewish Arbor Day, which occurs this month. A reminder that the bleakness of winter will give way to the Divine warmth of spring.

As the story begins, a man is planting a tree. . . A second man came up to him and said, "Why are you planting that tree? It will blossom after you die and you will never see its fruit." The first man replied, "I am planting it for my grandchildren." Jack M. planted trees, not just seeds, but complete foliage. He knew that he might not get to eat the fruit of the plantings but "his kids" would. (As you all know teachers refer to their students as "my kids.") I believe Jack M. is smiling over the kids he brought together. Personally, I am sad because of this situation and our loss of Jack, but I am also sure, because of his menschlikite, I will help another "KID," and that the lessons Jack M. taught us will bear fruit from generation-to-generation-to-generation. In his memory, whether you knew him or not, plant more trees of love and of life. Eat of the fruits of comradeship, and gain strength from each other. Then, what we have planted in each other's souls, will enable future generations to blossom with Eternal Joy.






