Monthly Shabbat Torah Study

In May, I am feeling joyful and sad at the same time. Last month, we bid good-bye to several people who had been an integral part of our Temple family for many years.

We had confirmed the largest set of confirmants at our Temple in many years; Miranda Goldstein, Cheyenne Goldfarb and Emily Mintz-Kreyns. These young ladies had been children in our school, been Bat Mitzvah and continued through our confirmation program. During the time of Confirmation class they discussed what it means to be a Jewish and American young adult. (Judaism doesn't believe in teenagers, they are too confusing. As soon as you are Bar or Bat Mitzvah, you are a Jewish adult complete with all the responsibilities thereof). The ladies' accomplishments are a source of great joy for all of us. Emily has indicated that she would like to join the faculty as a TA and we have discussed her role. This is further joy to have her be with us. She is not the first student to become a TA after completion of Confirmation class. (See below.)

That brings me to my sadness. Martin Greenfield will be leaving the faculty for personal reasons. We cannot say enough about him. As a student, he excelled, and then as a member of the youth group, he got my son Josh involved. This sparked Josh's further involvement in Judaism, not just here at Temple, but within the entire Jewish world.

More than that, after being one of my T.A.s, and teaching 5th, 6th & 7th grade history, when I called upon Martin to take on the Confirmation Program, he did it with excellence, studiousness and exuberance. What had deteriorated, he resurrected. I have no doubt our rise in registration and attendance in Confirmation was due to Martin's personality,

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - June/July 2015



If we want Judaism to be important to our children, we have to show that Judaism is important to us. I've said this often to religious school parents over the years, and it isn't just something I suggest to them, it is something I've tried to do with my own son. He is now 25, and while he isn't particularly observant, he does carry the Jewish values and ethics he learned at Temple Beth Emet, and identifies himself as one of the Jewish People.

One of the ways we show our children that Judaism is important to us is to be involved in a congregation. This can be a challenge, as families have a lot of demands on their time today. In my parents' generation, it wasn't unusual for only one parent to be employed outside the home, and most of those who did work were able to put their jobs aside at the end of the work day and on weekends. They had more hours to devote to outside activities, and there were a lot fewer activities competing for those hours. Temple has to compete with sports, band, martial arts, music, scouting, and other worthwhile activities our children are involved in, as well as the increased demand on parents by their employers and businesses. As a result, there are fewer people doing more volunteer tasks at Temple Beth Emet, and it has become difficult to cover all our needs and provide all the services and activities we would like, and have in the past.

That isn't to say we don't have new people who have become active the past few years, including both parents of our religious school children and those without children in the school. There just are not as *many* of them as there used to be.

Two organizations that have always provided opportunities to be active in Temple affairs are the Sisterhood and the Men's Club. Unfortunately, the ranks of those groups have thinned over the years due to age and otherwise, and newer members do not seem as interested in joining. Part of the reason is the lack of time people have to commit, and part of it is the inaccurate perception that these groups are primarily for the "old guard" and have nothing to offer them. *The truth is;* both the Sisterhood and Men's Club need the influx of new blood, and they would welcome the opportunity to turn things over to a new generation, who might want to remake these organizations to fit their needs and interests. It should be noted that both groups are egalitarian, and welcome members without regard to gender. (Doesn't that just sound like something our Temple would do?)

Being involved at Temple Beth Emet, whether in Sisterhood, Men's Club, Religious School Parents Association, on the Board, or on something else of interest, is a very rewarding and enriching experience. I never thought I would be the kind of person to become active in a synagogue, but I can honestly say that Temple Beth Emet is one of my favorite places to be, and my Temple family is something I truly cherish.

A MESSAGE REGARDING OUR DEAR FRIEND, JOHN EISENGER

It is incumbent upon me as President of Temple Beth Emet to write a few words about long-time Temple member and past Vice-President John Eisinger, who passed away in May, but my family feels a deep personal loss as well. We've known John and Carole for close to 20 years.

When my family first came to Temple Beth Emet, our son Jon was friends with John's oldest grandson, Ken. They are still friends. I got to know Ken's dad Steve and his mom Sherri. Steve was on the Board of Directors of the Temple, as was his father. There was an issue that came up at Temple and I wanted to let the Board know how I felt. That's how I met John, and that's how I eventually joined the board myself. I spent many years working with John on the Board, and you always knew where he stood.

When you say that about a lot of people, it is because the person was not shy about letting you know, in no uncertain terms, repeatedly and forcibly, where he stood. With John, you knew where he stood because he explained his opinion and the reasoning behind it calmly and respectfully. His reasoning was so well thought out that, having reached an opinion, it was often difficult to convince him to change it. It was easier to change your own thinking to his.

That was his way -- calm, considerate, caring, and educating. For many years, John was in charge of reaching out to congregants to let them know they were being thought of. My wife Diane reminded me that there wasn't an occasion that a card didn't come from John and Carole. Whenever we met, he would always ask how our son Jon was doing, Carole always does that, too. He was very proud of Steve and Sherri, and of Ken and Robert.

John had a wry sense of humor too, sometimes very subtle. He didn't mind if it took you a while to get his humor -- he was enjoying it himself in the meantime, and the slight smile was his "tell."

Over the years, when John and I found ourselves at funerals for Temple members who passed, he would always be pragmatic about the march of time and the circle of life. He would probably want us to be that way with his passing as well, but that is going to be difficult, because we all loved him so much.

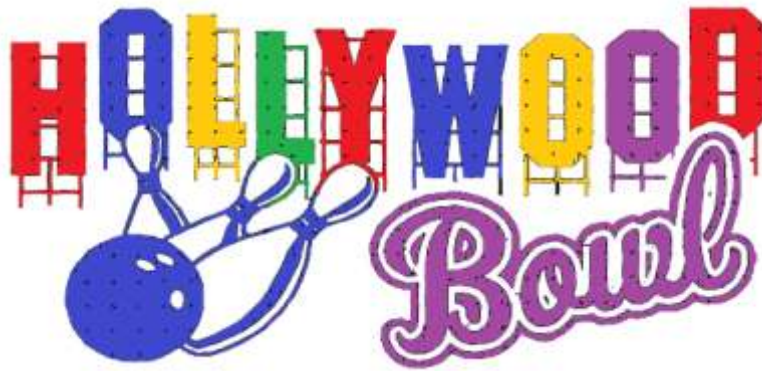

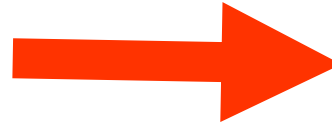
