These words still put chills down my spine whenever it is Purim. Haman sought to destroy us by implying that we were disloyal to King Achashuerus, because we have our own way of doing things. So it got me to thinking. How have Jews done their own thing and, furthermore, what have we been successful at? So I took two areas I




thought we had been doing our own thing and being awarded for it, for example: The Nobel Prize, the Olympics, the Maccabiah Games, and acting. We have had Nobel Prize winners from Argentina, Cesar Milstein in Medicine, from Norway, Neils Bohr in Physics, from Israel, S.Y. Agnon, in Literature and from the United States, Milton Friedman in Economics. The Olympics have brought us, <u>Nathan Cohen</u>, from New Zealand in rowing, and <u>Irina</u> <u>Slutskaya</u>, from Russia in figure skating and Maccabiasts, Rachel Hirschler from Guinea-Bissau in Badminton, and Huseynov Rashad from Azerbijian in Karate.

See, not all Jews become medical doctors, there are other ways to receive your doctorate. Now, we can ask, "What is the definition of a non-medical Jewish Laureate? A Jewish boy or girl who can't stand the sight of blood."

Truly, not all Jews are good dramatic actors, although it might be said that with so much 'guilt' given to each other, "Why don't you ever come over to visit. . . or why don't you drive a. . . or why don't you eat more. . . ?" We probably could perform greatly in any dramatic role, anywhere. (Just kidding ! Or am I ?) Guilt is so ingrained in us that we even joke about it. " How many Jewish mothers does it take to change a light bulb? None, I'll just sit here in the dark until they call." Seriously, we as a people have been involved in acting in Europe for at least several hundred years. What would a nice Christian child be doing as an actor or actress when they could make a suitable living slaughtering pigs or tanning their hides? No, acting was left to the Jews. And act we did. Especially in our own country. Here are some of the actors and actresses who have won the "Oscar," and others who I have met or

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - March 2014

Daylight Savings Time begins this year on March 9, when we advance our clocks one hour. Many of us bemoan the fact that we are "losing" an hour of sleep that day, but I think we should instead look at what we gain during Daylight Savings Time.

We gain an extra hour of sunlight at the end of our workday. For those of us who work regular hours, that means it won't be dark when it is time to head home. When we get home, there is still daylight to enjoy some extra time outdoors with the children, in the garden (hint: it's time to plant tomatoes,) or maybe a stroll in the neighborhood.

With March comes spring, and with spring comes renewal and deliverance from the darkness of winter. We celebrate this deliverance first this month with Purim, being the deliverance of a community, and next month with Passover, being the deliverance of our people. In both stories, our people were not merely the beneficiaries of the efforts of others. In Purim, after Esther and Mordecai foil the plans of Haman, the Jews of Persia had to stand up and fight their enemies, as the earlier royal decree allowing for the destruction of the Jews could not be countermanded, an additional decree was issued allowing the Jews to defend themselves. In Passover, the Israelites had to stand up, pack up, and leave everything familiar to them and march out into the desert. In neither case was success assured until the people took action.

Here at Temple Beth Emet our survival as a community also depends on the actions of all of our people, not just Rabbi Mark or the Temple lay leadership. Just as the Jews of Persia had to answer the call of Esther and Mordecai, just as the Israelites had to answer the call of God and His prophet Moses, the people of the Temple Beth Emet Family need to answer the call to support the Temple with their "wisdom, wampum, and/ or work." Consider *this* such a call to action.

Each of us has something we can contribute to TBE. What is your special gift? Do you have skills in managing finances? We need a permanent Treasurer. If you are good at building repair (either professionally or around the house) we have things that need to be done around our campus. Are you good at organizing events or activities? Can you solicit donations of goods for silent auctions or things the Temple itself needs? Are you able to make an extra financial contribution? 
