### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - November 2014

One of the wonderful things about being part of a community like Temple Beth Emet is the opportunity to share stories about ourselves, our families, and our individual histories. With the High Holidays over and no Jewish holidays until Hanukkah, and with the calm (and hopefully cool) of mid-autumn, it is a good time of the year to tell stories.



This past June, Diane and I took a group of college students to New York City to tour the fashion industry. We had a busy schedule visiting showrooms, retailers, design houses, designers, and museums. Our last full day in New York was free, and Diane and I took the opportunity to visit the grave of my grandfather, Abraham Goldstein. I had never met the man, and as a matter of fact he died when his wife was carrying my father, so my father never met him either. A subway ride to Queens and bus ride took us to Montefiore Cemetery on Springfield Boulevard. I had the grave location courtesy of a cousin, and a cemetery map from the internet, and with the help of a groundskeeper we found the grave.

Abraham Goldstein died very young. He was only 28 years old. He had come to the United States with his wife just 7 ½ years before he died of, from what I understand, a burst appendix. He left behind a wife, two daughters, and an unborn son. His grave is marked with a monument in the shape of a tree trunk cut off, signifying someone who died young. There is a low curb outlining the grave with the word "father" engraved at the foot of the curb. No one knows how a poor family could afford such a marker.

I had brought two stones from my garden, one representing me and the other my father. It was a very emotional experience. I thought about the fact that this man had never gotten to meet his son, and that my father had never gotten to meet his father. It seemed terribly sad that for almost 100 years, it was likely that the grave had hardly ever been visited. My grandmother married a widower in Memphis sometime after and formed an early Brady Bunch family. And I thought of my own father who has been gone 13 years. I was barely able to whisper a *Kaddish*. I took a stone from my grandfather's grave for the next time I visit my father's.

Despite the overwhelming sadness I felt, I also gained something positive. All of my grandparents were gone by the time of my birth, but I feel that by touching base with Abraham Goldstein that day I made a connection with him that didn't exist before. Rather than being just a story, he is now really my grandfather.

I was recounting this story recently at Temple when someone mentioned that she too had a grandparent buried at Montefiore, but there is a new and an old Montefiore cemetery in the area, so it might not be the same one. The thing is, however, that by telling my story I connected with someone else's story. Each of us has stories, and it is the connection of our stories that make us a family, so when we are gathered at Temple Beth Emet, let's make a point, if the opportunity presents itself, to share stories and learn more about each other.

Now, dear friends, I need us to rise again to the occasion. I need us to remember not one who has Passed, but one who is amongst us. I asked in September for housing for temple families. No one was able to help, so now I am asking quite frankly to help me perform the mitzvah of housing. This Temple family is staying in the Temple. It is a situation that no one finds ideal. In fact, it was set up as temporary housing with Jerry as Director of Building and Maintenance agreeing to the idea of the Temple as the last alternative to all other options. St. Jude's offers the same as we do with one additional factor, it has a flight of stairs to navigate up and down. This person is partially disabled which makes St, Jude's worse than Temple Beth Emet. Besides, we take care of our own. We provide people with help. We do Mitzvoth, we practice Pekuach Nefesh, we save lives.

I can get this Temple family, clean, safe housing, but I cannot do it alone. We need to do as we did for Jerry's family, show what Temple Beth Emet is capable of. If we all put our hearts and minds together we will give one of our own families a place to stay in Burbank where they can be safe. I am not asking that the Temple become a landlord, although I wrote about that in the Burbank Leader in September, I am asking for temporary housing either from a Temple family or paid for by the Temple. As the food and service was a source of consolation for Jerry's family and for us, let us console this temple family in their time of need. And as all were satiated with physical food, please, please help to satiate this needy family with the spiritual food of shelter and a home. Please send what you can to the Temple office, put a notation with it for Rabbi's Fund Temporary Housing.

And then tell yourself, "with this check," I did what Jerry would do.






