**"You get two Jews together, you get three different political opinions".**

In the middle of last month, the Temple had its annual general membership/election of the board meeting. This year's turnout was larger than most I can remember with two officer seats up for election and a Board of Director's place to fill. There were some complications to the voting process and by the end of the evening at least two Temple members left upset with the election process and this election specifically.

People being upset at the outcome of elections is not new in America or in the world for that matter. People believing that theirs is the only solution to their people's problems is not new. People believing that they and only they have the correct answer to what ails family, friends and community and that they are the only ones with the cure is older than Korah's rebellion.

Last month at the Sherman Oaks Center for Enriched Studies, I taught one of my favorite units, "The History of Modern Terrorism". One of the questions I asked my students was if they knew any "theological terrorists". At first, they did not know what I was talking about, but as we began to discuss the wanton use of violence in the name of G-d, we realized that no one religion has cornered the market on terrorism, but that all religions have their own terrorists.

In the book Terror in the Mind of G-d, the author, Mark Juergensmeyer, calls the cause of 'theological terrorism', "messianism", where different religious groups see themselves, and themselves alone, as maintaining the only true path to bringing the Messiah, the anointed of God, down to Earth to begin the end of Days. Alas, in Mr. Juergensmeyer's book and in real life, we too have produced people who feel that their way and only their path is the way to redemption.

I believe that for anyone to preach that there is only one way to create G-D's kingdom on Earth limits the potential for all mankind to create a world of Godliness. Each of us is a unique manifestation of creation. Therefore, each of us creates a

unique world unto ourselves. The Talmud agrees, "He who takes a life, it is as if he has destroyed an entire world". While Mr. Juergensmeyer is relating 'messianism' to acts of physical murder, the Talmud reminds us that 'embarrassing a person in public is equal to murder'. As far as I know, no one at the election embarrassed another person in public. Frankly, it was a tamer election than many I have attended at TBE. However, in the days, weeks, and months before the elections, words were expressed, feelings were hurt and ideas trashed. Why? Because we at Temple Beth Emet are beginning to be like the rest of the world and this negative messianism is beginning to creep into our congregation. I remember when Board meetings were more rancorous, but after the meeting people shook hands and sought each other out to work together for the good of the Temple. We need that now.

It is not MY path, but OUR path, up the great mountain of the Lord. As we climb, we must reach

out our hands to guide and help another, walk a little slower that we may all walk together and sing joyfully that there are enough of us to still walk together. If all we offer is one path to Judaism, then all we offer is one path to Jews.

It is not by accident that the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution states, "Congress shall enact no law... prohibiting the free exercise (of Religion)". In this July, where America is 235 years young, can we in good conscience, contradict the U.S. Constitution? I think not.

Therefore, from this time forth, let us be inclusive in our thinking, inviting in our speech and welcoming in our gestures. Then we can truly say we are "loving our neighbors as we love ourselves," (Tanach) and helping everyone to live a full "life" with complete "liberty" and "pursuit of Happiness" (Declaration of Independence).

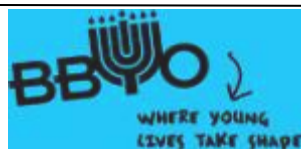

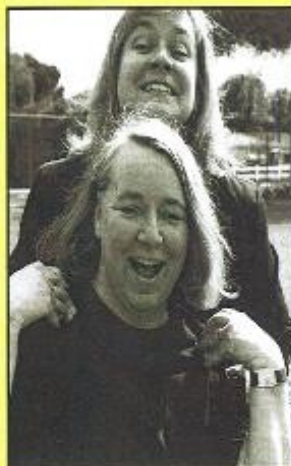
