


Elohai Neshama She Natata Li, Tahara Li" (Lord, the soul you have given me is pure).—Kabbalistic Mantra

In early 1980, a friend asked if I was as upset approaching my 30th birthday as he was. I told him, "No, I am much better adjusted to being 30 than I was at 20 because I've reached my goals". I had just begun to teach public school and was feeling pretty darn good about my life. Now I think back to those days and see how some of my later goals have been reached and some have not. More so, I see what has prevented me from being the best person I can be.

The process of returning to purify ourselves, our personal renewal, begins as we look back on what we have accomplished. We then need to strongly view how we have changed our selves to reach our goals and if that change has fundamentally altered our spirit, our soul, our neshama. Then we have to acknowledge the change from spirituality to 'base desires' and eliminate it from our dealings with others and ourselves. If these base desires have taken us away from our abstract self, we must ask ourselves, have we lost the capacity to dream? Have we lost the capacity to create? Have I lost my pure Neshama? If the answer is yes to either of these questions, then we must find ways to rekindle our spirit.

I am blessed, it is my job to walk and feed our dog. Every morning, I have 10-15 minutes of time with "Turbo". At that time, at least, I get to dream, to create, to find what is troubling me and to explore within myself ways to remove its hurt. I then examine the ways of removing the source of pain and see if it is "Neshama Diche" or "Base Anger". Then I formulate my plan of Spiritual action.

Please find calm time when you can do the same. It may be indoors in a quiet room or outdoors while walking your pet, but please search for what is preventing you from reaching your pure soul. Do as I do, examine the cause and discover the clean, pure, beautiful, spiritual solution to your problem and see yourself carrying out the plan. As you get more and more used to finding your soul and letting it lead you to the spiritual solution, the easier it will become to create living, loving, and Shalom goals for yourselves and those around you. As I have found many valuable things I thought I had lost, including myself, so you will also and then we can rebuild ourselves together.

Judaism teaches that alone we are incomplete, but together we are whole. Let us make each other whole as we unclutter our souls, let us create together a world built on spirituality and soul.


