I grew a bit concerned until Josh spoke up and said, "Aunt Ellen is on the phone (Skype) with Shahri". Of all the evening's surprises, that one gave me the most pleasure. My older son and his aunt have a loving relationship, but everyone is so busy these days. I remember how enthused Ellen was at the wedding. She hasn't changed and how proud Shahri and Adina were that Ellen was there.

To keep rekindling the connection of the younger generation to the older generation is very important for all of us. I am filled with great pride that Joshua sought to make his aunt visible to us, but I am equally proud of Shahri, who, by his decision, extended the connection. Further, for Joshua, the

connection from my sister to Shahri to us was so important, he spent hours nights before he left for Israel, to work on the problem. And while all of one's children are unique and special, I can surely say that most, if not all, of the younger generation take Social networking as par for the course of their life. As a parent and a Rabbi, I have concerns about some of the social networks. However, work with the younger generation, get to know their world, become familiar with their terminology. Let them guide you through the maze they call cyberspace. And when you are working and playing and learning with them, involve them in bringing the family close together. They will open up your eyes with what can be done to bring family unity in the midst of diversity. Remember, I was looking, simultaneously, to Maryland and Cleveland and they were looking at me. The mind boggles to

where we could speak to next. We can, we will, we must update each other. I will journey together to the promised land of love, communication and visualization.

This month we will celebrate Valentine's Day, remembering how a righteous man sought to ensure that words of love would continue to be communicated between people in love. One night last month I learned how 21st century righteous people send 21st Century Valentines. Why do I call them righteous? Because isn't the greatest form of Righteousness, to Love G-d "with all your heart, your soul and your uniqueness". And isn't the ability to speak face to face, Divine?

Dear Friends and Family,

Many of you have asked if there is something you can do to help Ben in his current battle with Cancer. The answer is yes there is!!

As some of you may know, as part of Ben's fight for a cure he will be required to endure another transplant, this time an allogenic transplant. That's a transplant from another person (MUD-match unrelated donor). In 2010, Ben was given a transplant with his own 'cleansed' stem cells (autologus transplant), unfortunately this was not successful. An allogenic transplant comes from donor cells. We are currently searching for a donor. Here's the good news for Ben, the Bone Marrow Registry is 9 million plus strong with dozens of countries participating. The bad news is that only half of those people searching and needing a transplant will find one. 10,000 people a year search for a donor, only 5,000 find a match. Here's where you can help!!

As Ben's treatment team searches the registry for a possible donor, Ben and I want to figure out how to pay it forward and give back to the many or ONE that will ultimately save Ben's life. We are doing this by encouraging all our friends and family (those that are able to make this huge commitment) to join the Bone Marrow Registry. In doing so, you become the potential lifesaving donor of someone in need, like Ben.

This is undoubtedly a huge commitment, so please don't join if for any reason you don't feel you could follow through. If you are inclined, please follow the links below.

Please remember, by registering you might be helping Ben but also all patients in need.

Go to the area where it says "join". All you have to do is follow the instructions and a swab will be sent to you through the mail. You will need to enter in a promo code. The promo Code is : hope4ben.

We would also like to keep everybody updated on Ben's battle with cancer, but as you all can imagine it is tough to keep everybody in the loop. Ben has created a blog on tumblr, which can be accessed by anybody, even if you do not have a tumblr account. Simply go to http://limegreenbracelet.tumblr.com/, and you can see Ben's updates on his progress. He is also currently working on expanding his non-profit organization Cuck Fancer, and would like to invite everybody to be part of his movement to raise awareness for young adult cancer. He has licensed Cuck Fancer as a 501 (c) 3 non-profit through the state of California and has many goals for this organization.
