PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - June 2016

And while you are at it, the light covers could use cleaning too.

Your spiritual home needs some attention as well. We are a participatory congregation, which means each family needs to take ownership of our campus.

Jose comes in to the preliminary set-up for Oneg Shabbats and finishes cleaning up afterward, but he is not a full time custodian. With Jerry Engelberg's passing almost two years ago, we lost our chief Mr. Fixit. Since we are perpetually fighting the budget, it would be nice of we didn't have to hire someone to fix or update everything that needs it. It is our Temple and we really should take care of it and take pride in it.

A lot of times we can walk past something that needs attention, and if we do it enough times, we don't even see it anymore. Other times we think "someone really ought to do something about that" without realizing that we, the Temple Beth Emet family, are the "someone."

Recently, Dana and Howard Sapper decided they could not stand the sight of the red post in the parking lot that is there to keep people from parking right in front of the door to Blum Hall. A long time ago someone had put a traffic cone on top of it to make it more visible, but it certainly didn't make it more attractive. This door has become our primary point of entry to the Temple. When the building was built, double doors were put in front opening to the foyer, but it turns out everyone comes in the side door. The Sappers wanted to so something to make the entrance more friendly and welcoming and to do something about that post. They set about placing a planter around it with drought-resistant plants. Talk about turning an eyesore into a sight for sore eyes!

The Sisterhood decided to replace the carpeting in Blum Hall, which has become rather ratty, and hope to do the sanctuary as well. What a difference that will make!

One of our members has promised that before the High Holidays the bathrooms will get a thorough cleaning, and I'd like to get some people together to paint them and maybe put in some better light fixtures.

A board member thinks we can do something with the Ark to make it look less imposing.

Here is where I am going to get in trouble, because there are a lot more people who pitch in here that I am not acknowledging!

I am not above getting my hands dirty either. Repairing light fixtures, replacing toilet seats, there is always something to do around our Temple and often I get the call first. Even Rabbi Mark was up on a ladder last month repairing the drop-ceiling in one of the classrooms.

(No offense to pink flamingo lovers, of course.) But if there is something you want to tackle, let us know. Some things need the approval of the Board of Directors due to the scope of the project, other times it can be informally approved.

Why should crises bring out the life draining feelings from our days and nights? Let us remember that crises don't last and that we can live through them. The best way to do that is to remember when we weren't in danger. The Chinese have a curse, "May you live in interesting times" meaning during times of crises. I have a prayer, "May you remember the interesting times and how you lived through them." We all have had crises in our lives, how we struggled with them and overcome them is what made us stronger. We must be strong, not only for ourselves, but for those we love.

Thank you Barbara Bolter for calling and checking up on me and to all those who sent cards and well wishes, thank you!




