

Our next meeting will be March 5th at 10:00 AM in Blum Hall. I would like to invite all interested to attend our next meeting. I look forward to meeting those of you who I haven't met yet. I have to apologize for going on "hiatus" last month in this



newsletter. As most of you know, I am also Treasurer for the Temple, and January is particularly busy tax season for the position of Treasurer. So much so, that I was not able to schedule any time for myself to write my monthly article.

Purim is on **Saturday**, *March 11th*, and The Sisterhood is holding their **Annual Dinner and Costume Contest** and then Rabbi Mark will host the Megillah reading, as always. In addition, on Saturday, March 11th, our famous potluck dinner will be served at **6:00 PM**, with the Costume Contest to follow. The Sisterhood is asking a \$10 dollar/each donation for the dinner, as you know, the donations will be put to good use.

The conclusion of January's article was a promise to keep everyone posted as to what The Sisterhood will be planning from January through June, before the next term of new Officers. The Temple has found itself getting quite tight financially, so The Sisterhood voted to help out by delegating two hundred dollars (\$200.00) a month to advertising for a three-month stretch, in order to be able to bring in monetary income to the Temple by renting out Blum Hall for meetings and events. At February's Board Meeting, two of The Sisterhood's lovely ladies, Eileen Martin and Fran Bourne-Johnson, volunteered their time to be the "booking agents" for Blum Hall, and to field any calls that come to the Temple regarding reserving the social hall for meetings and/or events.

Many temples across the nation are having a difficult time getting new members as the younger generations are not "joiners." So therefore, many temples are having to rent out their school rooms and halls to make ends meet financially. Unfortunately, Temple Beth Emet is no different. One of the most logical ideas that I read in a Jewish Journal about four years ago, was that the best way to support your local Jewish community was to join a Temple. I had no way of knowing that shortly after I would meet someone that would invite me to join her as a guest to a couple of events at her Temple, where I would be so welcomed and the cost to join so reasonable, that I would be able to join a Temple, support my local Jewish community, and better educate myself in the beliefs and prayers that are Jewish. I can understand what the Temple is experiencing, because even though I was able to recruit a few new members to The Sisterhood last summer, these younger members are not working the once-a-month meetings of The Sisterhood into their schedules. I know that they are receiving the minutes that I e-mail out every month, but I would very much like to get to know them better and I would like them to have a say as to what The Sisterhood is doing, not just reading about what other members of The Sisterhood have decided while they were not in attendance.

The Red Tent by Anita Diamant

Synopsis: Her name is Dinah. In the Bible, her life is only hinted at in a brief and violent detour within the more familiar chapters of the Book of Genesis that tell of her father, Jacob, and his twelve sons.

Told in Dinah's voice, Anita Diamant imagines the traditions and turmoils of ancient womanhood--the world of the red tent. 
