This past Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur we were talking about our

home at Beth Emet, physically and spiritually. What its roots are what its trunk is and where its fruits are going.

In a few days it will be Sukkot, Tabernacles, where we build simple structures to remind us of the travels in the desert and later, in the land of Israel, to go out and tend to our crops.

These are simple structures as they will be temporary. We, as Jews, now a days add different decorations to them. No Jew I know wants to live in just a simple place. Check out our art in the sanctuary, usually a no, no, but, for or our independence, a yes, yes. Coming right after Yom Kippur where we cleanse our souls with confessions of sins, these buildings also signify that we are at ground zero for possessions and artificial things in life. Now is the time to rebuild! But we must rebuild in our own individual way.

The first and most important addition to the four sides and 3 walls and the roof of Palm branches, are the people who we have invited to our Sukkah. They even have a special name **USHPIZIM**. Traditionally, they are 7 Biblical

leaders of our people: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Aaron and David.

Without going into detail, these 7 men are very different in personality, spirituality and for sure temperament. We have before us everything from Warrior to Poet, arbitrator to enforcer, dreamer to realist, monogamist to polygamist, believers to doubters. And everything in between!

Other guests not mentioned are the great women in the Bible: Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, Leah, Asenath, Tzipporah, Elisheba, Deborah, Michal and Bathsheba.

Perhaps the rabbis who set up the tradition felt that the great men of the Bible would come if invited and bring their wives, but it still bothers me that the women are not mentioned by name for an invitation.

It makes me think, more so, about who we invite and who come to our Sukkah. This past High Holidays people have rejoined the temple who left for various reasons. How many though are never going to rejoin because of hurt feelings, embarrassment, and lack of acknowledgment? Just like the great women of the Bible, they have been left out of recognition.

To utilize the song, "Let there be peace and let it begin with me..." I want to be the first:

"ANYONE WHOM I HAVE HURT, OR IGNORED, OR TREATED POORLY, PLEASE FORGIVE ME.

COME AND JOIN US IN OUR SUKKAH."

Please, members of the Temple Beth Emet community, if my pledge has touched you at all, reach out to those you have hurt in any way, let us join in the mitzvah of helping the return of exiles We still have time to ask for forgiveness, and if we are blessed, maybe those people who were once sitting, eating laughing and, yes, crying with us at our temple will come home to us and then we will sing, "Barukim Haba'im" so loud, that the hills of Burbank will shout with Joy.

As did our predecessors, we will "*reform*" the concept of USHPIZIM to its true meaning, HONORED GUESTS OF THE HOUSE OF TRUTH !
