When we lost a Temple member, Jim Mattis, Temple Treasurer and Ritual Chair with Rabbi Kramer, used to say, "The Angel of Death has not been kind to us again." A few weeks ago we lost a long time member and Temple Secretary Sylvia Gross Sutton.



Sylvia became more than a Temple member when she took over the secretarial reins after June Beck died suddenly from complications of heart surgery. To put it mildly, we were in disarray. June was more than just the Temple Secretary, she was counselor, confidant and often the first face of Temple Beth Emet. Sylvia knew what huge shoes she was slipping into, but as we found out over the next 20 plus years, she truly showed, "dynamic people come in small packages."

She did everything we asked of her and more. The more was her relationship with me. She would go beyond the normal boundaries of our relationship to nudge me. She nudged me about who needed a Rabbi pep talk, what my appointments were, so I wouldn't forget them, and why we needed to be more socially and politically active.

She was always very much involved in the BHCC. Later it changed its name to the Burbank Human Relations Council and Sylvia would tirelessly work on the Days of Remembrance. One day, I found out that she was now in charge of the Holocaust Speakers' Bureau of the Burbank Unified School District and once again our relationship changed. Sylvia was a master coordinator and scheduling all those Holocaust speakers was no mean feat. One day, after going through Temple business and reminding me who to call to cheer them up, I asked Sylvia how the Speakers'

Bureau was going and, for the first time I could remember, she was saddened. She did not have enough survivors and/ or their children to speak at all the schools on the days they were requested. So, I said to her,

"I will go if you need me. I only have one request, don't make me speak at 9:00 AM. Valley traffic is so bad". True to her word I almost never had to speak at 9. One day she called me. Here was this magnificent person who worked so hard coordinating so many important things dealing with the Holocaust, The Days of Remembrance, including the City Council, mini-Night of remembrance and the Speakers' Bureau.

"I am so sorry, Rabbi, I don't have anyone else, could you please go?" She was so humble, so genuine in her request, I just couldn't and wouldn't say no.

Of course, it was one of the best experiences I ever had as a speaker.

Sylvia didn't limit her efforts to just Jewish causes. Her work for the Burbank Human Relations Council was to benefit all groups of Burbank citizens. Woman's Rights, I believe, was right up there on her agenda. She was appalled at the actions of men who treat women as chattel. She did not want anyone to be treated as another's property. Someone asked me to describe her in one phrase, I said, "She was a Jewish suffragette", and I meant it. A suffragette is one who believes in equal rights for all and who has suffered for his or her actions. But Sylvia was full of positivism. Anybody who plays tennis into their 80s is positive about themselves and the future. She read the *Los Angeles Times* until the stroke right before her passing.

My favorite memory of Sylvia amongst the many memories I have of her, was that every time I would come to visit her, her first question was, "How are things at the Temple?" She was someone who put Temple, if not first, certainly up there with her greatest loves. And for this and for all your activities to better people's lives, to paraphrase George M. Cohan, 'Our Temple thanks you, our Human Relations Council thanks you, Our Holocaust Speakers' Bureau thanks you and, Most of All, the people of Burbank thank you.

Rest in Peace Sara Bas Nataniel!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - October 2018

Just before Kol Nidre services started last month, someone came to me with a bit of a concerned look. "I hope your Appeal tonight is positive" this person said. Apparently my August message came off a little dark and some were worried. That was actually my intent, to an extent. I needed to shake off some of the complacency here about our Temple's future. On October 7, 1893, Chicago Evening Post journalist and humorist Finley Peter Dunne introduced his readers to the character of Mr. Dooley in a newspaper column. Mr. Dooley was a bartender and his satirical sayings were aimed at the politics and social issues of the day. One of Mr. Dooley's most famous sayings is actually widely misquoted as "the job of the newspaper is to comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable." In August, I wanted to do a little afflicting to the comfortable of our family. Now I want to offer some comfort to those who may have been unnerved.



In my Kol Nidre Appeal, I told you that the family of our late friend George Davis had agreed to match our High Holiday pledges and gifts up to a total of \$5,000.00. I am pleased to report to you that we did hit and exceed that target amount, which also represented an increase in pledges from 2017. Additionally, our ticket sales exceeded those of last year as well. We have not completely solved our financial problems, but we do now have some room to breathe and move forward.

We had a very successful High Holiday season, both in terms of finances and the services themselves.

What a joy it is not to have to move boxes of stuff to St. Jude's and hang the curtain! What a joy it was not to have to take down the curtain and move everything back!

Our Sha-Na-Na Tova choir was extraordinary as was Robyn Kreisberg, who did double duty as cantorial soloist and choir director. Please see our individual acknowledgements of our choir members on Page 5. Our accompanist, David Goldstein, was superb as always - a consummate professional. We had two marvelous instrumental soloists - Marlene Dreyfuss on the mandolin for Kol Nidre, and Barbara Harmon, cellist on Yom Kippur Day. This talented and giving group of people provided us with a warm and spiritual musical experience for our worship, and Rabbi Mark, as always, wove scripture and our daily world in to meaningful and thought provoking teachings. High Holiday services at Temple Beth Emet draws us all in as a community. You really cannot sit in the sanctuary and not feel part of the service.

I would be remiss if I did not thank our Office Manager, Victoria Gaffney, for all the craziness she dealt with making sure congregants got their tickets on time, those joining us could buy their tickets, and everyone got pledge cards. Victoria was closely assisted by our Treasurer Eileen Martin, who sometimes had to act as "bad cop." Thanks also to Craig Wiseman, our videographer and Amanda Goldstein, who took over when Craig could not be there, making sure our services were streamed on line. ***Synopsis:** In this “thoughtful, introspective, and moving account” (*The Washington Post*), former NBC news anchor David Gregory probes various religious traditions to better understand his own faith and answer important questions about who we want to be and what we believe.

When David Gregory was a reporter covering the White House, President George W. Bush asked him a question: “Gregory, how’s your faith?” Raised by a Catholic mother and a Jewish dad, David had a strong sense of Jewish cultural and ethnic identity, but no real belief—until his marriage to a Protestant woman of strong faith inspired him to explore his spirituality for himself and his growing family.

His spiritual journey has taken him inside Christian mega-churches and into the world of Orthodox Judaism. He’s gone deep into Bible study and asked big questions of America’s most thoughtful religious leaders, including evangelical preacher Joel Osteen; Mohamed Magid, the imam of a big northern Virginia mosque; and Cardinal Timothy Dolan, the Catholic Archbishop of New York. He has even reconsidered his own childhood, where a belief in God might have helped him through his mother’s struggle with alcoholism.

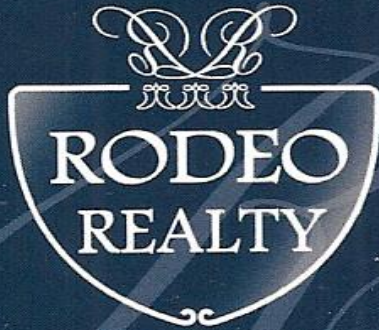
