This month it will be 30 years since Anna Sobel, my father's mother, my bubbie. Passed away. She was a lady who through many trials and tribulations including the loss of a daughter who was only 22, and a husband who was only 56 in 1946, still kept her positive outlook. She was abandoned in Lithuania at the age of 18 by her step mother who went to the United States with her (the Step mother's) children. My bubbie ended up being homeless for a year, until money arrived from her father to come also.

On a positive note, she married her childhood sweetheart, my zeide, Morris Sobel in New York in 1911. Until her death in 1989, her love of Judaism and Israel was 150%. She was the typical Yiddisher Mama, making cholent, baking mondel bread and unbelievably happy when we could visit. And I owe her my love for Israel from her and my zeide's Zionism.

In addition, she had a great sense of humor and could tell great stories. I once asked her, why my Zeide didn't stay a kosher butcher like the rest of his family instead of becoming a tailor?

She said, in a tape I still have, "They told us a tailor makes lots of money in America!"

Then she paused and said,

"They Lied!!!!!"

Poverty was a part of her life, before and through the Great Depression, but she never lost her love of the little joys in life, like kissing me full of a mouth of pickled Herring! To this day, I still hate the smell of pickled Herring. But I still love, like her, doing things to help others, especially, the quiet mitzvot that get little or no publicity.

A week after my Bubbie died, Mina realized she was pregnant with Joshua. As in many cultures, she believes you don't announce the fact until the pregnancy is very far along. Her comment to me that morning was most surprising.

"You may tell your father, only him. Let this news help him with his sadness." You see, my father was very, very, close with my Bubbie. Before Alzheimer's took her mind, he would speak to her every day until he was almost sixty. So, her death was especially painful to him.

The month of January coming after the holiday season often leaves us somewhat empty. As I remember my Bubbie's passing, I remember that small act of kindness on the part of my wife. To me, we now have two months until Purim, which has kindness built in, to leave our comfort zones, our traditions and to do something special to raise other peoples' spirits.

Let us agree that in honor of Anna Sobel and Mina Sobel and all the Eshet Hayyil's we know, to step out of our January comfort zone and do acts of lovingkindness, no matter where they take us!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - January 2019

Love your fellow human being as yourself (Leviticus 19:18). "This is the central *principle* of the *Torah*" (*Rabbi Akiva*, 2nd C.C.E.)



It was discovered December 5 written on a wall in a restroom stall at Cal State Northridge. "Mass shooting in Sierra Hall 12/12/18." Coming on the heels of the mass shooting at a night club in Thousand Oaks, some students were understandably shaken. Some noted that the shooter in Thousand Oaks and the shooter in the Las Vegas shooting the year before had both taken classes at CSUN. Campus police advised that they were investigating, but that the threat did not appear credible.

Then, just a few days later, a hand written tirade again threatening a mass shooting on campus on December 12. "Shaken" was replaced by actual fear. December 12 was the first day of finals week, and many students indicated that they would not set foot on campus that week, accusing the University of caring more for the calendar than the students. Twitter lit up with angry comments such as "no grade is worth my life."

The University president directed that instructors scheduled to give finals on December 12 were instead to make alternative testing, such as online exams, available. No finals were to be given on campus on December 12. Instructors were also directed to make alternative testing available on other days exams were scheduled, but did not specify on-campus finals would not take place.

Some instructors just canceled the last day of class and finals. "Due to the multiple threats of a mass shooting on campus at California State University Northridge, I've canceled classes and moved finals online. My students are afraid and so am I. These are scary times," one tweeted.

My wife Diane was not scheduled to give a final on December 12, but had class on the 11th and finals on the 13th and 18th. She did not want to give exams online, as online exams are inherently less reliable and valid, as some students will invariably give in to the temptation to review notes and the text during the exam. After consulting with our Preschool Director, Victoria, and Rabbi Mark, I offered to proctor exams in Blum Hall for any of her students who felt uncomfortable going to CSUN. About a dozen students made their way to Burbank to take their exam.

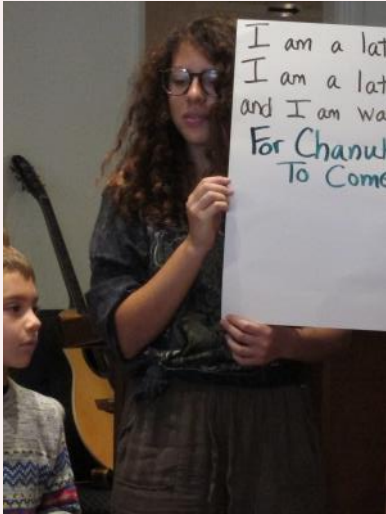
I was glad to be able to offer the hospitality of Temple Beth Emet to these students. For one thing, as a parent, I am sure other parents would appreciate that their children were provided a place to take their exam where they felt safe. Additionally, education is very important in Judaism, and in some small way, we were able to further the education of these students. As a people who have all too often been the target of terrorism, we should take whatever opportunity we can to thwart the aims of those who engage in terror -- and to be sure, whoever penned these threats intended to inflict terror, either as a joke, a way to disrupt schooling, or whatever other possible reason.

Finally, opening our doors to these students was an act of love and a demonstration that we are truly the *Temple With a Heart*. How could we have done otherwise?

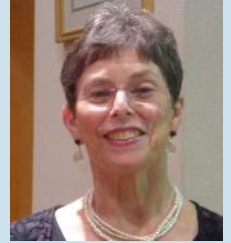
There has been interest in our next ***ISRAEL TRIP***. While we are not planning a trip in 2019, if there enough interest, 2020 may be a possibility..

will read and discuss: ***The Ice Cream Queen of Orchard Street*** by Susan Jane Gilman

In 1913, little Malka Treynovsky flees Russia with her family. Bedazzled by tales of gold and movie stardom, she tricks them into buying tickets for America. Yet no sooner do they land on the squalid Lower East Side of Manhattan, than Malka is crippled and abandoned in the street.

Taken in by a tough-loving Italian ices peddler, she manages to survive through cunning and inventiveness. As she learns the secrets of his trade, she begins to shape her own destiny. She falls in love with a gorgeous, illiterate radical named Albert, and they set off across America in an ice cream truck. Slowly, she transforms herself into Lillian Dunkle, "The Ice Cream Queen" - doyenne of an empire of ice cream franchises and a celebrated television personality.

Lillian's rise to fame and fortune spans seventy years and is inextricably linked to the course of American history itself, from Prohibition to the disco days of Studio 54. Conniving, profane, and irreverent, she is a supremely complex woman who prefers a good stiff drink to an ice cream cone.

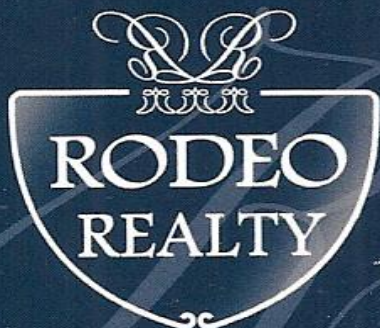
