I want to share with you some helpful information that my boss sent out to our company recently. Headspace is an app that provides guided mediations, as well as, sleep and movement exercises that are designed for overall wellbeing; including guided walks and meditations for children. They have partnered with the LA County Department of Mental Health to offer access to their service for FREE to LA County residents for the rest of 2020. (They also have a featured collection called "Weathering the Storm" that you can send to your loved ones that live outside our county lines.)

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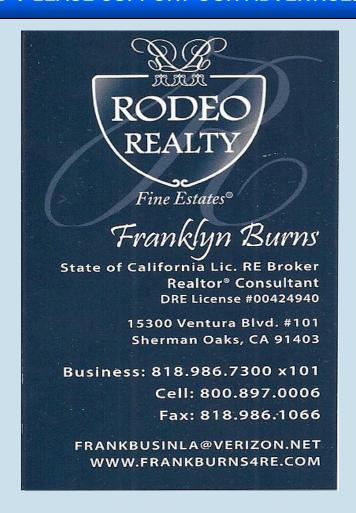
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
