


"And Jacob went out alone." (Genesis 32)

In the middle of this month we will celebrate Israel Independence Day, the 5th of Iyar. Many of you will say that Israel Independence Day is May 15.



Never has a country been so aptly named than Israel. Israel is the name G-D gives to Jacob after he wrestles with, a man, an angel, a demon or G-D. Scholars disagree over the Hebrew text. I personally see the State of Israel as one country that has dealt with demons. To name a few, first demons that Israel had to deal with was the terror of the Holocaust and its effect on the survivors. Next came the refugees from the Arab countries from Algeria to Yemen who were expelled after Israel became a country. Incidentally, the number of Jews Israel absorbed, 600,000 plus equates to the Palestinian Arabs who fled in 1947-49. The next demons Israel has fought with were the countries who denied aid to Israel and stopped being her ally or at least friendly to her. In 1967, right after Israel was victorious and recaptured Jerusalem. One of my Youth group leaders, I was a member of Young Judaea, made a comment then, "Now the world is afraid that we Jews will do to them what they have been doing to us for the last 2,000 years". Soon after that, the vast majority of Liberal or Left leaning countries removed their support and camaraderie with Israel to go to the "Palestinian"

camp. I use quotation marks because not all Palestinian Arabs, Christian and Muslim are anti-Israel. Speak to those Palestinian Arabs who remained in Palestine when it became Israel. I know of several, personally, one was my roommate at Tel-Aviv University when I studied there 50 years ago.

There is another demon, Israel has to face. The demon of false accusations. To be called an "Apartheid state" by a former President, REALLY? You can tell he has never lived there.

And we must keep in mind that all this was done in the face of those who sought to militarily destroy Israel. Most certainly there are many middle easterners who still do. But the number is increasing of those who see Israel as a beacon of Peace in that troubled region.

Now that we have looked at the demons Israel has wrestled with, let us look at the "tie", ala Jacob and his demon.

Israel settled both large numbers of Holocaust survivors and Jewish Arab refugees. It was not easy and not always totally successful. For a humorous look at early Israel find the movie *Salah Shabbati* with Hayyim Topol.

Further they became custodian of several million Palestinian Arabs who the United Nations saw as refugees and not Jordanian citizens or Egyptian citizens. Israel made a mistake in agreeing with the UN regarding the Palestinians and therefore, giving up the victory direct negotiations with the indigenous leadership of the Palestinians, Mayor *Hamdi Canaan* of Nablus and Sheikh Mohammad Ali El-Jabari of Hebron would have brought.

Now to those who would condemn Israel in the press, even our own *Los Angeles Times* has shown a bent to go for the cheap anti-Israel headline and not revealing the full facts, Israel has not done a great PR job. Interestingly enough, the best "Press Officer" Israel ever had was Benjamin Netanyahu during the Gulf War when on CNN he showed how Israel was sheltering in place and not retaliating to the missiles of Saddam Hussein. Truly the world is more comfortable with Jews as victims and not victors.

Where are we the Jews outside of Israel in this wrestling match? Before Jacob went out to face the threat from Esau, the reason for the wrestling match, he sent his family away to another place to keep them safe. This sums up our role vis a vis Israel. Since the day it was established 73 years ago, Israel has made sure we were in a safe place. Just remember the raid on Entebbe in 1976! I was in Israel then, too!

And as Israel has kept us safe, we are to do the same for her. As we wrestle with American demons, keep in mind we share common anti-Semitism with Israel, coming from both sides of the political fence. Write letters, call your congressmen and /senators, go to protests. Do not support companies that sponsor the Boycott of Israel. If newspapers write anti-Israel articles, write letters to the editor with the facts. We are here at Temple to

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - April 2021

Beginning the second night of Passover we began counting the *omer*. *Omer* means sheaf and refers to a measure of volume of unthreshed stalks of grain. We count 49 days or seven weeks. We can think of it as seven cycles of the Creation. It recounts the time between our leaving Egypt and the giving of the Law at Sinai, which we commemorate at *Shavuot*.



Traditionally, the time of the counting of the omer is a period of semi-mourning during which one is supposed to refrain from haircuts, shaving, listening to instrumental music, or conducting weddings, parties, and dinners with dancing. There is one day these prohibitions are lifted, and that is *Lag B'Omer*, literally the 33rd day of the *Omer*. My parents were married on *Lag B'Omer*. This year, *Lag B'Omer* falls on April 30.

One of the traditional stories of *Lag B'Omer* is that it was the day on which the plague which had afflicted the students of Rabbi Akiva ended, after killing 24,000 of them and leaving just 5. There are other stories and explanations, but this year in particular the vision of a plaguelifting seems to resonate most strongly.

By Lag B'Omer this year, all adults in our state and in many places in the country will be eligible to receive one of the three COVID-19 vaccines that will help to lift the plague which has afflicted our lives for more than a year. Although there is still concern over rising numbers which may be attributable to virus variants or the premature lifting of precautions, we can see the end of this pandemic and a gradual progress toward "normal life" (although we're not exactly sure what that will look like).

Lag B'Omer is traditionally commemorated with outings (during which children traditionally play with bows and arrows), bonfires, parades and other joyous events. Clearly, we cannot indulge in all these activities yet, but we can enjoy some more normal activities with precaution. And of course, after Lag B'Omer the counting resumes until Shavuot. So while we can rejoice at the expansion of vaccine availability and the recent decline of incidence of serious illness, we still have to be cautious, follow guidelines, and take precautions, until we arrive at our destination, our public health "Sinai," (where we will surely receive a new set of mandates carved in stone!)

Diane is now just about two weeks past her second vaccination, I am about a week past my first. Our son will soon be eligible for his vaccination and we are looking forward to the day, not too far off, when we can again hug as a family for the first time in over a year.

If we all just do what we need to do just a little while longer, we will soon be able to gather together again as a Temple family. We have so much to look forward to! So keep washing your hands, wear a mask when out, maintain social distancing, and get that vaccine. Better days are coming!

Hello Temple Families,

I hope your Passover celebration has been enlightening, enjoyable, and that you and your family are able to celebrate in good health!

The light at the end of the tunnel just got brighter. Many of our seniors and members who work in health care or who have conditions that make them more vulnerable to complications from covid-19 have already received vaccinations.



BUSD has announced it will start a hybrid model of in-person and distance learning in April. Parents were given the option to sign their children up for some in-person tutoring, and they plan to begin in April. Here is a quote from Superintendent Matt Hill:

"The Burbank Teachers Association and the Burbank Unified School District have come to an agreement that the start of school for all grades will be April 12. We will meet on March 29th to finalize the details, but we have reached an agreement that the morning will stay in Distance Learning and the afternoons will be in-person. At all traditional sites, the students who are opting to participate in the hybrid model will be on campus twice a week in A and B cohorts. The principals will be determining cohorts based on a variety of factors and will be communicating your specific cohort in the future. More details will be shared the week of March 29th. In the meantime, we are excited to return students to campus and still support our students who remain 100% in distance learning." (Superintendent Matt Hill)





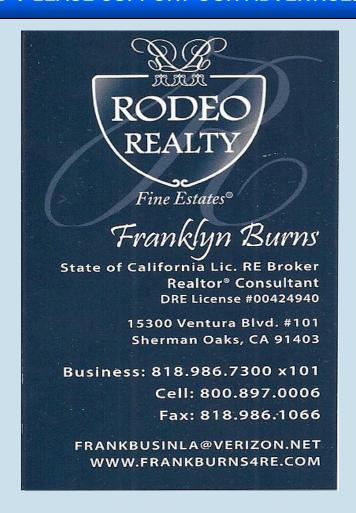
