

"It is a land of Milk and Honey, but..." (Numbers14:8)

Last month, June fifth, Jews all over the world read the Torah portion entitled "Shelach" named for the 12 spies Moses sent to



scout out the Land of Israel before our return. Ten of the spies came back disillusioned, not with the land but with themselves. "It is a land flowing with Milk and honey, BUT...We were ants in our own eyes when we viewed the Canaanites", they lamented. Their attitude reflected what they felt that our people could never conquer the land. Only 2, Joshua and Caleb differed," G-d is with us, we will not fail", was Caleb's answer.


