## "We pray for them because they deserve to be remembered" (Adapted from Scribbles and Crumbs)



We are the believers in the great "OUR", and the great "US, for example, "Our God...who commanded US". This is part of the pattern found in 95% of all Jewish prayers. It is probably one of the reasons we are the most socially involved peoples the world has ever known. Often I have given you general ways to extend the we or us. Today. I want to propose a variation on a prayer that will increase our holiness, our sanctity and our preservation of life.

Sometimes the pure numbers of the deceased of tragedies overwhelm us. Such it is for the Holocaust with me. As the Talmud teaches "each person is a world unto his/herself", every day when I see or hear the numbers of the Coved 19 victims, I feel the same. As I believe in an active Judaism, I thought, what can I do for those we know and those we don't know? Our congregation has had its victims Coved-'9 as have many other congregations. But what of the nameless victims who died that we don't know and perhaps don't have someone to say Kaddish

For years when I have performed funerals and unveilings and when Mourner's Kaddish was about to be said, I have asked those present, even if they were not mourners of the person being remembered, to recite the Mourners' Kaddish with us because on any given day we don't have enough people to say the Kaddish for those who have died in the Holocaust, Israel's wars, and America's conflicts where people have given up their life for righteous behavior.

I would tell the assembled, "Say the prayer and like that old T-shirt, Let God sort it out". The more anonymous the better. In this way, the prayer becomes more than itself. It becomes an act of Tzedakah, righteous giving.

I am pleased to share with you that we requested of the High Holiday congregation to do this as well and the response was outstanding. We will continue to request and I am sure be responded to positively as we say the Mourners' Kaddish for those we know and those we don't therefore showing love physically with our hearts and spiritually with all our souls.

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - October 2021

Rabbi Mark is a big believer in angels. He frequently points out incidences in people's lives where angels have intervened to avert disaster or deliver a message. Diane believes in angels, too. We have a hallway filled with framed cards depicting angels in paintings and illustrations. There are sculpted angels hugging the door frames and elsewhere in our house. In Judaism, angels appear throughout scripture and rabbinic literature.



There are different classifications of angels, each with their own responsibilities. Every Shabbat we chant Shalom Aleichim welcoming the angels that join us as we celebrate and observe the day.

I tend to be a bit more skeptical about angels. I am not so arrogant as to deny their existence, but growing up in a secular and rational world, I cannot readily accept their power to influence our lives. Do angels exist or do they not exist? Do their actions affect our lives or don't they? I'm not entirely sure. Maybe they do. Probably they do. Or not. The thing is, I am entirely comfortable holding both possibilities in my life.

One thing I do know for sure. If angels do exist, one of them is named Sean, and he drives a taxi in New York City.

Last month Diane and I were in New York. Our nephew and his wife were having their long (COVID-19) delayed wedding ceremony at their home in the Berkshire Hills, about an hour's drive from Albany. We had decided to spend a few days in New York City, and after comparing airfares and hotel rates, we decided to sandwich the family function between a couple of days in the city before and after the event. On our first day in New York we were caught in tropical storm Ida. While we personally escaped the worst of the storm physically, it did disrupt our museum plans and then, at the last moment, our train travel plans to and from Albany, where we were renting a car for the family weekend. We secured Greyhound tickets. Upon our return to the Port Authority bus terminal in New York City I found that I no longer had my wallet. I made a report with the police, and we made our way outside to get a taxi to our hotel, which was a short distance from the terminal

I mentioned to the dispatcher what had happened and he directed us to Sean's cab, telling him what had happened and saying "Don't run the meter." Sean was so positive and helpful. "If you need anything, call me. Money, whatever." There was no charge for the cab ride and he refused a tip. We took his number so we could call him for our ride to the airport when we left the city, but that morning he was in Brooklyn and none of his friends were available.

Sean was our angel that evening. I was grateful but not entirely surprised at his kindness as I have found that New Yorkers, despite their reputation as rough people, are among the nicest and most helpful people you will ever meet.


