


"May All Enemies of Your People be struck down speedily!" (The Amidah Prayer)

The Haggadah is not a book devised at one time in Jewish History but was and is constantly being added to. I own a very unique book, "The Polychrome Haggadah" which explains when and where the texts of the Haggadah come from. that they had to make peace with one of the two most powerful Middle Eastern Empires, Egypt and Babylonia. They chose Egypt for the obvious reason, it is a lot closer to Jerusalem then Babylonia.

Recently, someone said to me, "I don't care what the Russians do to the Ukraine after what the Ukrainians did to us during the Holocaust."

I am not negating the crimes done to our people then by members of the Ukrainian society but I see in the quote about Laban a different way to look at the Russo-Ukrainian War. What the Nazis and their Ukrainian allies did to us during the Holocaust pales in comparison to what was done to us by the Russians from Stalin back to the Tsars. In fact the reason so many Jews lived in the Ukraine was because we were forced to live there and nowhere else in Russia. It was so bad for us that it was called "The Pale of Settlement" because the people who lived there were so poor and undernourished they were Pale.

And now, many Jews live in the Ukraine, openly practicing their Judaism where under the Communists they could not. Communism sought to remove Judaism from the Jewish consciousness. DNA remained but knowledge and practice was removed.

The leader of Russia sees himself as the Tsar of the 21st century and seeks to harm innocents in much the same way as did his ancestors. Just as in the Passover story, a person who thinks he is a god enslaves innocents and destroys lives. The innocents flee for their lives. Such is the universal message of Passover. Freedom will come, but at a heavy price!

All these factors bring the question for us, what can we do to help the people of the Ukraine? Even if and when there is a cease fire, much damage has already been done. I know we are all contributing Tzedakah to help the Ukrainians, Jews and non-Jews. That is our way.

I ask you to do more. At your Passover Seder, when you read the Haggadah and the two sentences about Laban are mentioned, as shown above, please substitute, Putin for Laban. Further when Pharaoh is mentioned in the Haggadah, also substitute Putin.

If you don't have the opportunity to celebrate Passover with a Seder, please every day, at least once a day, recite this Hebrew phrase,

"L'Kol Hamalsheenim l'yh'yeh Tikvah" (May all evildoers have no hope)".

In this way our hearts go out to the innocents who are being harmed by others.

B'ahava and B'Herut (In love and in Freedom).

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - April 2022

For many years Diane and I, and Jon when he was younger, would go down to friends in Orange County for Seder. Diane and I knew him from college, and they got married not to long after we did. We watched each other's children grow. For years she has made this matzo kugel that is so good that I bought the book with the recipe and actually made it one time. It was a rather involved process, so I haven't made it again. We also have played an after-Seder game called "I'm leaving Egypt" where we go around the table adding to an alphabetized list of things we were bringing with us, and the next person reciting the list up to that point before adding their item.



Sometimes the calendar was such that the Seder fell on a night Diane was teaching, so I went solo, and we begged off the night when my mother had passed earlier that day, but otherwise their Seder was a fixture on our calendar. Many times the first night of Passover fell on a Friday night, which meant fighting the Burbank to Orange County traffic, arriving rather spent. Recently, their daughter's schedule dictated moving the Seder to Saturday night, often the second night of Passover, and the traffic was easier to bear.

In early March 2020, the invitation came with the Seder set for Saturday, April 11. Unfortunately, we had our Temple Community Seder set for that same night, so it looked like we would miss the evening. Then the pandemic hit. Along with the rest of the world, we thought the emergency would last a couple of weeks and then we could resume our lives, but as March progressed reality set in. We cancelled the Community Seder, but we still held out hope we would make it down to be with our friends.

Reality got even more real, and about the time Diane and I decided we were not going anywhere we received word that "my Rabbi just told me to get over my fantasy about holding a Seder in my home. I have to cancel. I'm devastated." We messaged back "Hag Pesach sameach! Next year in Orange County!"

But the next year, 2021, things had not gotten to the point where we could get together.

This year, we are all vaxed and boosted - Diane and I are double-boosted - and we are planning to resume getting together with our friends for Seder. Unfortunately, our Temple Community Seder will not resume this year. Things these past few months were just too uncertain to start planning. Next year in Blum Hall!

This past year has been one of stepping carefully out of the shadow of the pandemic into the light of our new normal. Looking at what we achieved, we resumed in-person services and religious school and groups are coming back to add life to our campus. As we celebrate our people's journey from oppression to freedom, we should also be mindful of our own journey these past two years. "We were slaves to Pharaoh in Egypt, and Adonai, took us out from there with a strong hand and with an outstretched arm."

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and brought us to this season.

Hag Pesach sameach. Happy Passover.
