I remember this time of year for many reasons and for seeing many sights. One of my fondest memories is driving down my Grandmother's street in Flushing, Queens, and counting the different houses with candles in the windows. We knew the houses by the number of candles in the windows. Nine for us and five for our Italian neighbors. Now probably that street has candelabras of seven candles representing Kwanzaa. Hanukkah is known as the Festival of Lights, Christmas has the story of the North Star guiding the three wise men. As far as I know, Kwanzaa and its positive message for African-American young people is to help them foster a stronger identity.

So it was for us in the 1960's. Hanukkah was an afterthought until the Civil Rights movement. Then young Jewish activists who were helping others in the civil rights struggle, saw that we had a holiday near Christmas that represented what parents wanted for their Jewish children. Identity with something authentic. No more 'Chanukah Bushes', but Hanukkah menorahs. No more one great day of presents but eight days of presents. No more wondering what happened in Judaism from the end of the Tanakh

(Torah, N'Vi'im and Ketuvim), until the Talmud but Jewish lively history from Alexander the Great to Mattathias the Hasmonean and his son Judah the Maccabee!

The first recorded war for religious freedom. And the rebels, our rebels, were successful.

Then why in all the carnage is Hanukkah called the festival of lights? Because we are commanded to put the menorah in a place that the outside world can see it. Truly, years ago, I thought that freedom was an American gift to Jews. Freedom to display our victory. Freedom to show off our menorah in the window.

"G-d, I love America", I would say. Then I read that the action of putting the Menorah in the window is really 2,000 years old. What a pleasant, **no exhilarating**, surprise! My only hope is that our neighbors are as proud of their heritage as we are of ours.

Therefore, let the Festival of Lights give us the energy to enlighten others about the power of heritage, of ancestry, of timelessness.

Further, let us bring light to those think they have no history, no heritage, no ancestors, no one as role models. Let us use Mattathias' words," All who are for G-d and the covenant follow me". Then we, the originators of the covenant, will bring others who lack the ancestral covenant to be with us and follow us. And each time we light a candle for Hanukkah let us rededicate ourselves to bring pride of heritage to all we met and know.

Not just for pride of ancestral home, but pride in self. Hillel was right! Matters of sanctity must be promoted. And there is nothing more sacred than helping someone realize their value. We, the descendants of the Maccabees, must defend those who have been struck down by the hammers of prejudice, racism, sexism and the other 'isms' that steal identities and make humans invisible! We must not let their shields be broken! We must purify their 'temple', their bodies, and their souls, so all see their worth. Then and only then can we wish for a true Festival of Light for all!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - December 2022

I have to admit, I'm not really a cheese pizza fan. I prefer a combination of toppings, many of which cannot be mentioned in the publication of a Jewish religious institution. But I had some really good cheese pizza recently. It wasn't from one of the big pizza chains, but it was from a major seller of fresh-baked pies -- Costco. Yes, Costco is one of the largest pizza chains in the United States. And while you may not get a choice of thick or thin

crust, pan or hand-tossed, it is one of the few pizza spots you can pick up a jumbo package of paper towels or a dozen croissants.

The particular cheese pizza that greatly impressed me was served in our own Blum Hall and marked the return of Pizza Night after an absence of more than two years. One of our newest members of the Board of Directors, Felicia Van Dyk, along with our very active Religious School Parents Association members felt it was high time (Chai Time?) to bring back this beloved monthly event, which brings together our Temple family prior to Shabbat services.

Pizza Night kicks off a month of resurgent activity at Temple Beth Emet. The sale will also feature some collectable die-cast NASCAR cars and collectables, as well as a bake sale.

On December 18 our Religious School will be holding their Hanukkah celebration with a special talent performance at 11:30 AM, and everyone is welcome. That evening we will be holding a brief Hanukkiyah lighting at the Burbank Town Center at 6:00 PM (yet another returning activity) before returning back to Temple at 7:00 PM for an outdoor celebration featuring lighting out giant Hanukkiyah, singing, and an appearance by our own Adult Choir.

This month's activities are big steps toward restoring our Temple as our community center for social and religious activities. It is Hanukkah, which means "dedication," and we are finally and fully re-dedicating ourselves as an active house of gathering, worship, and study.

While we are mindful of the recent increase in COVID-19 cases locally, as well as the "tripledemic" of COVID-19, flu, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) being reported, it appears that with proper precaution, including vaccination and mask wearing indoors, we feel comfortable bringing back some of the activities we have had to forego the past couple of years. 


