because of the examples above as well as many others.

Cat, in Hebrew is *HaTool*, which, I think is an acronym for *Hayyim*, *Torah* And *Lahoot* (Life, Learning and Passion). Almost everyone I have spoken to who owns a cat tells me that Cats let you know what they are thinking with 'exuberance'.






