


"We shall not tarry in keeping your Torah of Truth and when we are (or do) wrong PROMPTLY admit it." (Psalm of Serenity, verse 10)

Times, something that gave me pause," Pop, the three men ran toward the soldiers!"

Most people, if not all, released from capture, coming upon soldiers, tend not to run at them. They usually, put up their hands and walk very slowly, waiting for commands from the soldier in charge.

When I was discussing this scenario with Mina and my concerns, she reminded me that several hostages have testified that they were drugged by the terrorists while in captivity.

The use of Hashish by radical fighters in Medieval Iran before going into battle gave rise to the term, "Hashishin" (Assassins in English) the name, first, of a group of Shi'ite fanatics and now, political killers. Hashish a mind altering drug, produces in its taker the feelings of invulnerability.

We are all trying to deal with this tragedy in our own way! The above is my way of handling the deaths of those three men.

Dan Jacobs, a TV commentator for News Nation took a different tack. He acknowledged that the IDF immediately admitted the error and took responsibility for the men's death. He reminded his audience that during the current conflict the other side has not admitted to causing the deaths of hostages but instead blames the Israelis .In fact, as the news of the incident has come to light, deaths of these innocent men has caused many people to see the soldiers responsible disciplined. How different are the photos of members of Hamas cheering the deaths of Concert goers and Kibbutz members!

At the end of this month, we will celebrate Tu B'shvat, the New Year of the Trees. I am reminded of a classic vignette from our folklore.

"An old man was planting a sapling and a younger man came by. The young man said to the older man, 'Why are you planting that sapling? You will never see it grow up.'

The Old man replied, "I am not planting it for me. I am planting it for my children and grandchildren."

In the midst of this great horror, full scale war, the Israel Defense Force has spoken to the future generations with its honesty and admission of errors, especially when it comes to human life.

I ask, I beg, I plead with our adversaries, wherever they are in this world, to do the same, speak truthfully to your children and grandchildren so they will remember you as honest and responsible caretakers of your heritage.

And may we, through our efforts, create blossoms of truth which will, in turn, produce the fruits of honesty, which is Shalom!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - January 2024

One of the things that makes Temple Beth Emet unique and something we have always be proud of is that we have never had a mandatory building fund assessment. Our friends at Burbank Temple Emanu El have a \$360.00 annual building/safety assessment. Temple Sinai in Glendale has an assessment for new members of \$300.00 for the first three years and an additional \$400.00 security assessment. Valley Beth Shalom has a \$3,500.00 building fund assessment paid over ten years and \$610.00 security assessment annually.



The founding families of Temple Beth Emet did not find it necessary to impose a mandatory building fund and back then no one even thought about a security assessment. They relied on their own sense of responsibility and dedication to the Temple to assure the purchase, improvement, and maintenance of the Temple.

Somewhere along the way, we seem to have forgotten the need to provide for the physical upkeep of our Temple. The building fund we had years ago has long since been spent on repairs and occasional updating. Yet the building and its systems continue to age. Recently we had quite a scare when the furnace in the sanctuary, which is original to our late 1970s building, stopped working. We were fortunate that our HVAC experts at Chuck Doidge Heating (courtesy plug) were able to get it working again, but every time they come out they remind us to start saving money for replacement. Unfortunately, we have barely been able to meet our current expenses every month, and there is nothing left to put away.

Our congregation has the advantage of owning our synagogue campus free and clear, but our campus needs repair, and that is the responsibility of each of us.

We have never had a mandatory building fund assessment and we do not want to start now. Instead, we are asking everyone to take on a voluntary assessment to re-establish a building fund to provide for the maintenance and improvement of our Temple. We are suggesting a minimum of \$180.00 per year, or \$15.00 per month. Some of us are not able to commit to that assessment, and any contribution is welcome. Others of us can go well beyond that amount. As always, we will rely on own individual sense of responsibility and dedication to our Temple.

Our Board of Directors has decided to name this fund the Herb Murez Building Fund to recognize the dedication Herb had to Temple Beth Emet and his constant concern for its welfare.

As we turn our attention to providing the funds to maintain our Temple, we also need to look at our other resources for maintenance -- the members of our community. Some of us are handy with home repairs or have access to people willing to contribute materials and effort to the upkeep of the building. We need these non-monetary contributions as well and there is no better way to "take ownership" in our Temple community than to put physical effort into its home. Just contact the office and let Ralph know what your talent or resource is.

Thank you in advance for your commitment and support of our Temple With a Heart. With everyone's help, we can assure our Temple is strong, secure, safe, and inviting.



by Michael Lewis

Synopsis:

When Michael Lewis first met him, Sam Bankman-Fried was the world's youngest billionaire and crypto's Gatsby. CEOs, celebrities, and leaders of small countries all vied for his time and cash after he catapulted, practically overnight, onto the Forbes billionaire list.
