Rabbi Says:

“And I will make your seed as the dust of the Earth; so that if a man can count the dust of the earth, then shall your seed also be counted”. (Genesis 13:16)



Near the end of this month we will celebrate Tu B'Shvat, the New Year of the Trees. Comparable to American Arbor Day, except that Arbor Day is in September and Tu B'Shvat is now. Why, do you ask, do we have tree planting ceremonies in the middle of winter instead of the fall or the spring, as does the rest of the world? The answer has to do with Trees' roots in Judaism and Judaism's belief in Hope and Actions.

Last month I did a baby naming for the first born of one of our graduates, and as we recited the prayer over the wine, I thought about how our children are the fruit of our “loins” and our hopes for them never waver even through times of great “darkness”, “coldness” and “storminess”. We plant the seeds of new life and then tend to it and watch it grow. Our care is rewarded by their creations and, G-d willing, we are able to see the fruit of their labors. The prayer over the bread has a similar theme. We praise G-d for bringing bread from the Earth, but we know that is not true. It is up to us to plant the seeds, tend to the crops and then make the dough and bake the bread in order to make it edible. Our children's lives are the same for us. We hope that if we provide nourishment, physical and spiritual, the “seeds” will grow into young “saplings” who will continue to grow and then create branches of their own.

Rabbi Says: (Continued from page 1)

When we plant trees while it is still cold, rainy, snowy and demonstrate other examples of inclementness we affirm that the weather will improve and that we cannot be deterred from completing our task, the growth and nourishment of the Jewish People. We also believe by extension that G-d will help us to reach our goals, even though; the immediate situation may be interfering with those goals. By never giving up hope we affirm that the world will improve for ourselves and our children.

Actions are always important in Judaism. A comment on the role of actions in Judaism comes to us from Pirke Avoth (The Sayings of the Fathers.) as an analogy with trees: "One whose deeds exceeds his wisdom, unto what is he compared? Unto a tree the branches are few and the roots many, so that even if all the winds in the world come and blow upon it, they move it not out of its place."

So by planting trees in the midst of winter we show by our actions that our faith is strong so strong that it cannot be torn down even in the harshest of weathers. By implanting in our children that they are to us the hope for the future and by tending to their needs yet allowing them to grow into the adults they need to be, we affirm the duality of hope and action found in Tu B'Shvat, the Jewish Arbor Day in the winter.

Tu B'Shevat Trail Mix

3 cups old-fashioned oats	1/2 cup coarsely chopped almonds
1 cup raw sunflower seeds	1/4 cup safflower oil
1/2 cup lightly toasted sesame seeds	1 cup honey
1 cup w heat bran	2 cups mixed dried fruit
1/2 cup oat bran	(raisins, golden raisins, dates,
1/2 cup w heat germ	figs, apples, pears cut into small
1/2 cup coarsely chopped walnuts	pieces)
1 cup raw peanuts	

Pre-heat oven to 300. Mix together the oats, sunflower seeds, sesame seeds, w heat bran, oat bran, w heat germ and nuts. Add oil and honey.

Pour the mixture into a baking pan with high sides. Bake until the grains and nuts are lightly colored and thoroughly cooked, about 45 minutes. Stir the mixture every 5 to 10 minutes. Let it cool completely. Stir and break up any clumps that might form while the trail mix cools. Add the mixed dried fruit. Store in airtight container.

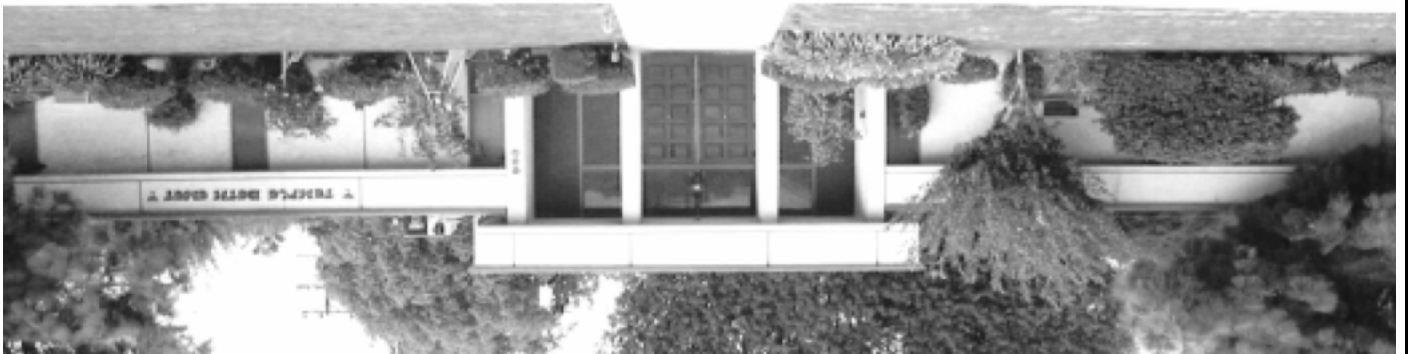
