I guess I am a Socialist. If the criterion being used these days of caring for others brandishes me a Socialist, than I guess I am. If wanting to make sure that all people have food to eat, shelter to live in and an education for themselves and their children. I guess I am a socialist. Gee, I always thought I was just a Jew. You see Judaism teaches us that we are created in the image of G-d, Rashi says that refers to our Neshomah. THEREFORE, we are to act in the image of G-d and in the Siddur it says G-d acts “sustaining the living, resuscitating the dead, supporting the fallen, healing the sick and releasing the imprisoned.” But now caring for our neighbor, “You will love your neighbor as yourself” Leviticus 20, means only in certain areas. He can't want what you want, a decent livelihood, a simple home, a positive family life, an illness free life and an unfettered existence.

The ideals of Loving One's Neighbor involve all these things for us. We must either give outright to each other or invest in each other's lives. It really sounds more complicated than it is. When I was a young man, my house was the house where my friends gathered. Perhaps it was because my mom was so understanding of teenagers; she was a teenager herself when I was born. Maybe it was because she had a brother six years younger than herself, who she practically raised, or maybe because she was a woman with a huge motherly attitude. In her later life, she owned a doll store. Anyway, my friends came and stayed, even through college when a friend was having a problem, they'd come and stay. One teaching to me stands out, because we weren't wealthy by any means

and extra mouths could be a strain. My mother always said, "when company comes, no problem, we'll just open up another box of spaghetti and another bottle of tomato sauce (all respects to Ragu)". This is the attitude I believe many of us have lost. It is not the fancy that people crave, it is the real. Peanut Butter sandwiches made with love and served in a home have it all over a burger on a bun served by a stranger in a drive-thru. People want to be a part of "family". My mother's second teaching comes to mind, "The first dinner in our house, we do your dishes, after that you do your own dishes, so pay attention." My mother was always a good teacher, especially of dish washing. Seriously, when you are made to feel you are part of a family, you are a part of family. And our family at one time or another consisted of people of different religions, sexes, creeds, political persuasions and sexual orientations. This was in the 1960-70's long before the idea was in vogue.

America needs to return to those days, when people were judged not by skin color or native language or orientation but by contribution to house, to street, to neighborhood, to America. We are facing difficult times for ALL Americans. We can not merely complain about this country's problems but go out and lead the way to reconciliation, to conciliation, to "Tshuvah". This year as we repent our sins, let us not also be guilty of the sin of omission, that where we could have opened our arms, our hands, our hearts and our homes, instead we closed ourselves, pointed fingers, turned our backs, locked our doors and said not in my back yard. If we have been open in our hearts, our minds and our uniquenesses, than, in fact, we will have made the purest of T'shuvah's (return to G-d) for wasn't it G-d who sought to make us in the divine image and took Eve from the part closest to Adam's heart.

Courage trumps a hate crime

How could a boy of five conceive of a world in which a stranger, filled with hate, would walk calmly into a community center filled with children and fire 70 rounds from a semiautomatic rifle, on a mission to kill Jews?

One bullet hit Ben Kadish in the hip and tore through his abdomen. Another crushed his thigh bone.

Paramedic Todd Carb and his partner, Danny Jordan, plowed out of Fire Station 87 in Northridge with only sketchy information about a shooting. When they arrived at the community center and realized children were inside, they charged into the building before getting police clearance. Carb heard a woman screaming and hustled down a hallway to where she knelt next to Ben Kadish. Carb knew instantly that the boy was gravely injured.

By LA Fire Department rules, paramedics were supposed to call for a helicopter to transport a badly injured child to a pediatric trauma unit. But 19 years of experience told Carb there was no time. They rushed Ben within minutes to Holy Cross Medical Center.

Today, Ben Kadish is 15 and Todd Carb is in his 29th year of service with LA Fire Department. Ben's family believes that Carb's quick decision helped save their son's life.

Todd Carb is a member of Temple Beth Emet.

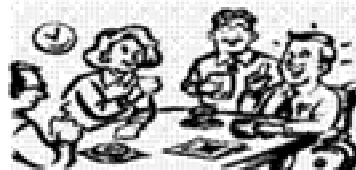

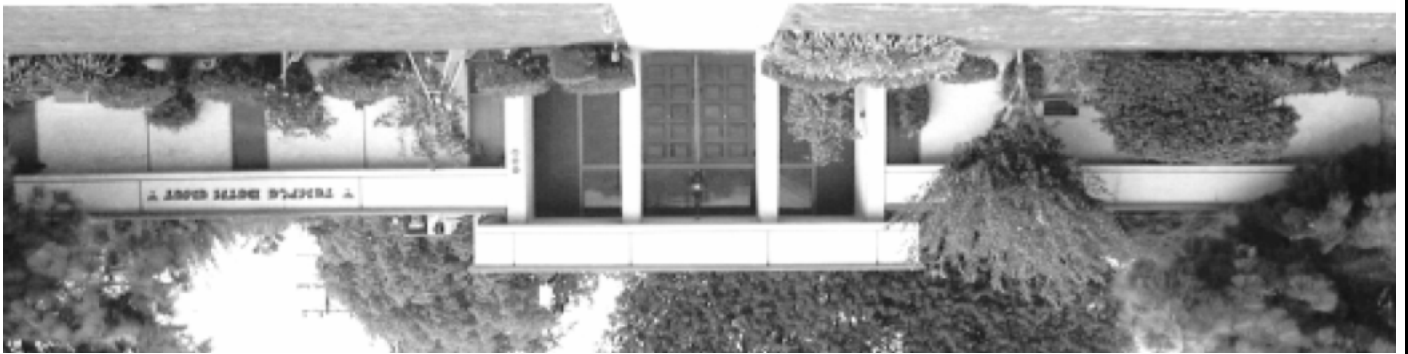
