Rabbi Says:

“You may not see the end of an action, but neither are you free to desist from it altogether” (Talmud)



Last month, we did something we had never done before at Temple Beth Emet. We had a Shabbat Service in the Sukkah. Why were we in the Sukkah? To inaugurate our new First Friday of the month service for young people of all ages. It is so new that we still haven't agreed on a formal name for it. It was truly a first, with new songs, new versions of old standard prayers and best of all new people. About seventy, in total experienced something special. Before I go further, to all who participated from suggestion to conception to inception to fruition to reception, Todah Rabbah. There were glitches to be sure but so it is with any first experience. Yes, it took work and co-ordination and even a few hurt feelings but when it was finished, the people there both had the spiritual experience and the fun of being at the birth of a new era in Temple life. For me personally, I had the pleasure of “harmonizing” with Robyn and the Junior choir and the pure joy of teaching and living the biblical dictum “make new our days like of old”. Once again I was a melamed taking complex concepts and creating simple visions that our children could relate to. To me that is the essence of the Rabbinate, making Judaism available and accessible to all.

How do we go about continuing our “Firsts”? First, we come up with ideas for our Temple. Temple in Hebrew is Beit HaKnesset, house of entry. The Beit HaKnesset in Eastern Europe was the place that the whole shtetl would go to. Not just for prayer, but for recreation, discussion and fellowship. We need now to bring that

The Young People's Service is the first Shabbat of every month and starts at 7:00 p.m. instead of 7:30 p.m. It is more relaxed and shorter, but is still a complete Shabbat service. If you missed it in October, we hope you will join us at our next one.

As we approach Thanksgiving this year we are mindful that many of us and many of our neighbors continue to suffer from the effects of the current economic conditions. If we have less than we had last year, let us be thankful for what we do have. If we are blessed to have been spared from setback, let us remember to do tzedaka to help those who are in want. After delivering our food collection from the High Holidays, we received a thank you letter from Burbank Temporary Aid center, in which they related the extraordinary demand this year for their services. We continue to collect non-perishable food at the Temple.

concept back. The Chai Society and the Men's Clubs monthly meeting format is one framework, but there are others. Seriously, in my life I have met Jewish actors and accountants, boxers and 'brains', generals and jingle writers, wrestlers and wranglers, x-ray technicians and ex-cons. All have something to offer, let us offer each person a place to come and feel at home. THE GETTYSBURG ADDRESS

Fourscore and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting-place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate...we cannot consecrate...we cannot hallow...this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us, the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus

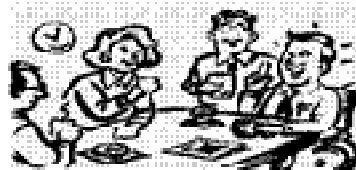
