Rabbi Says:

“The only thing we have to fear ...is fear itself” (FDR January 1933)



This month, on April 11th and on April 12th, we will commemorate two very different anniversaries, one is the Holocaust with Yom HaShoah, and the next day is the 65th anniversary of the death of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, the thirty-second president of the United States.

At the time of his death, FDR had been President for 12 years. Stretching from the dark days of the Great Depression through the attack on Pearl Harbor to victory over Germany, President Roosevelt had been the father figure to the country. His use of Fireside Chats to calm and then encourage the people is both masterful in their use of the, then new technology of broadcast radio and the hiding of his disability due to polio. To me, Franklin Roosevelt and the Holocaust reflect the complexity of his Fireside Chats. I was brought up on the above quote of newly inaugurated President Roosevelt and what it meant to our people as well as all Americans affected by the Great Depression. In those dark days with businesses failing and great unemployment causing serious upheavals in the fabric of America, FDR stood before the people and told them that America would not fail to fulfill its role of serving the needs of all Americans. Coming from a Union family, FDR was bigger than life for what he did for the working man and woman. He was more than a president he was almost a “demi-god”.

Then in the 1960s books began to be published which criticized President Roosevelt for his conduct during the Holocaust including turning away the SS. St.

President's message



One of the most significant community events in the City of Burbank is the annual Burbank Days of Remembrance presented by the Burbank Human Relations Council. It is sponsored by several churches and synagogues in Burbank, including Temple Beth Emet. Our own Sylvia Sutton is a central figure in the organization and is directly involved in the production of the program by the Council. Congress instituted the Days of Remembrance as the United States' annual commemoration of the Holocaust. The event normally takes place on the second Tuesday in April, but this year it has been moved to the third Tuesday due to the special election for the local Assembly seat. The program is held in a different sponsor location every year and this year the program will be at Burbank Temple Emanu El at 1302 Glenoaks.

The program this year will feature a screening of *A Child on Schindler's List*, presented by KNBC news personality Fritz Coleman, who was the film's host. The film is the story of Leon Leyson, the youngest of the 1,200 people saved by Oskar Schindler. Leyson later came to Southern California where he went to college and became a teacher. The documentary was awarded a Golden Mike for Best Documentary as well as a Los Angeles Area Emmy.

In the past, the program has often featured a talk given by a survivor of the Holocaust. While I was a teenager active in the Aleph Zadik Aleph youth group, I attended a regional event that included a speaker who was a survivor. The speaker was the mother of one of the adult counselors. It was difficult to look at this warm, lively woman and think of the horrors she went through. It was strange to think of her as the mother of someone we knew well enough to constantly give a hard time!

Louis and failure to bomb the rail lines into and out of the concentration camps. It has been postulated that he turned his back on the Jewish Peoples' struggles against "The Final Solution" while he waged a war on the Axis Powers. Frankly, I am conflicted. I don't know how to reconcile the author of, "We face the arduous days that lie before us...with the clear consciousness of seeking old and precious moral values" for what is a greater moral value than saving lives? President Roosevelt about the Holocaust as early as 1942 and yet did not openly inform the American People about the extent of the destruction of European minority groups, Gypsies, Slavs, Jehovah Witnesses, Homosexuals, and the rest.

But, as in this case, many times, for me, conflict leads to a strategy of action in place of an answer. In other words, I know what to do based upon President Roosevelt's stirring words. I do not allow fear, nameless, unreasoning, unjustified terror to paralyze me from acting in a manner to move forward to my goal. I just don't do it alone. I enlist others to help me. WE then speak with a voice of frankness, vigor and, especially important, Honesty. We, We, We, must do this. I do not know if by speaking out President Roosevelt would have ended the Holocaust any sooner, but I know that now we must continue speaking out about our Holocaust and other genocides, fratricides, and 'final solution's. We then stop their expansion and prevent new terrorists from arising. All we need do is honestly alert others to our concerns and our anguish over potential future victims. Speak up and speak out!!!!. In this age of instant audio and visual communication we have the power to end terror and fear of any kind from being visited on the future generations. All we need ask is that our families, our friends and our communities come together toward our goal the end of terror of any kind. To that end, paraphrasing FDR, 'we ask the Blessing of G-d. May He protect and guide us in the Days to come'. If we do this, together we will defeat all who practice such acts of terror.

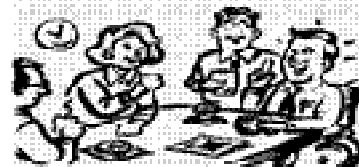
