"THE TEMPLE WITH A HEART"

" Happy is the people who know your joyful sound, by the light of your countenance they shall go" (Psalms 89:16)



There were many things that gave me joy at the High Holy Day services this year. I got to see old friends I had not seen for a while, I was able to lead services with Cantor Boudaie, and people told me that my Drashes really touched their hearts. Most of all, though, I enjoyed the fact that we "streamed" the service live to people's homes. Now, those who are physically unable to join us can at least spiritually be part of the congregation.

Let me give you some history of the streaming project. On Thanksgiving Day, several months ago, after talking to Shahri, my older son, on "Skype", a computer communications website, I wondered aloud if we had finally arrived at a place where we could serve our members, who are afraid to come to Temple on a Friday night in the winter because it is quite dark by 7:30 PM. I asked people I knew who did "streaming" and they told me that it was possible if we had a unit with enough bandwidth to capture and send the image in real time and in a smooth manner. To my aid came Alan Barlow. He took the streaming idea and began to collect data and hardware ideas to enable us to go live with our services. He and Craig Weisman worked tirelessly to make live, real time, Temple Beth Emet services a reality for those not able to participate in our sanctuary. After a few trial exercises, one where we had a beautiful picture, but no sound, and one with fantastic sound, but no picture, we were ready. Rachil Barlow was all set to have her Bat Mitzvah. Alan and Stacie sent out e-mails to people telling them to tune in. Rachil led, people in-house followed along and those as far away as Israel prayed too.

Our prayers had been answered, but High Holy Days were fast approaching. How would people know where to find us in cyberspace? I don't know whose idea it was, but by Rosh Hashanah, Jerry Orlemann, the Temple Webmaster, had placed the links to our Stream under Announcements, High Holy days, right on the front page of our www.TempleBethEmet.com website (or you can search www.ustream.tv for Temple Beth Emet). How do I know this?

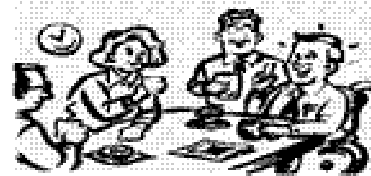
Happy Fall to All from Chai Society. Hope everyone is
