PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - September 2025

Sometimes, usually when I am filling in for Rabbi on a Friday night, I will look out at the congregation and notice that most people are sitting further back in the sanctuary, leaving the pews in the front rather empty. "Everyone gets an upgrade to Business Class" I will announce, and motion for people to move forward. A few of you will accept the invitation, but many of you prefer to remain near the back. That's okay. But when you sit closer, you are closer to the "action" -- you are closer to Rabbi Janet and Robyn. You are also closer



to the Ark. Does that mean you are closer to God? Maybe not, but I think when you are closer to the front, you are more engaged.

As we approach the High Holidays, it is a good time to think about our own engagement and involvement at Temple. Over the years, we have become a more intimate congregation, and that means each of us is a more prominent member of the Temple family. We contribute, of course, just by showing up, but our Temple can be much more than just a place to come and pray. This requires something more of each of us, though, and in the coming year we can all find new ways of contributing to keeping Temple Beth Emet a complete Jewish community -- a house of worship, gathering, and study.

Rabbi David Cohen, writing in the *Wisconsin Jewish Chronicle*, put it this way: "Why do synagogues matter? Simply put, they provide a place to meet three intrinsic human needs: the need to belong; the need to believe; and the need to become." He continued by noting that when we belong to other groups, such as sport leagues, professional organizations, or groups such as scouting, we relate to them as consumers. "The synagogue, however, is different; it's a community of covenant," he notes, "Where the consumer approach to community is transactional, the covenantal approach is relational."

Our Temple is not a club, not a group, not an activity, it is a family. At a recent Temple Board meeting we were discussing ways we can present ourselves to potential new members. We all agreed the most important asset our Temple has is our people. We are welcoming, we are friendly, and, we genuinely enjoy being with each other. The Board members joked that we are like the bar in *Cheers* -- everybody knows your name. We have another advantage -- unlike those big, fancy synagogues, we are small enough that newcomers don't get lost and there is no place to hide. Our little Temple With a Heart opens its heart to everyone, and we want everyone to make themselves at home.

As we begin a new year, may we all continue to enjoy everything that makes Temple Beth Emet the special, comfortable, loving family it is, may we find ways to enlarge our Temple experience, and may we be blessed to welcome new people to our family.

On behalf of myself, my family, the Board, and the staff of Temple Beth Emet of Burbank, *L'shana tova tikateivu*. May we all be inscribed for a good year.
