PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - December 2025

What if they gave a party and the whole city of Burbank showed up? Well, it seemed like that is what happened on November 21 at the Holiday in the Park street festival on Magnolia Boulevard, organized by the Magnolia Park Merchants Association (MPMA). Holiday in the Park started about 30 years ago, and in 2014 the MPMA took over the production. Originally it was a night when merchants along Magnolia stayed open late. The hot chocolate and cookies they handed out has largely been replaced by food trucks and street vendors, although if you know where to go you can still get a cup of cocoa and a candy cane or two. Now, Magnolia is closed between Buena Vista and Hollywood Way and the street is taken over by vendor and community organization booths. There is a car show, a Ferris wheel, and this year a free shuttle from the Buena Vista and Northwest Libraries.



This was our Temple's second year at Holiday in the Park. Our booth was lit up with string lights and battery lanterns hung with Hanukkah decorations of all sorts. We had bags to give out with dreidels, stickers, and Hanukkah gelt. Our table was draped with a Hanukkah runner and strewn with chocolate coins and topped with not one, but battery operated Hanukkiyahs. We had some flyers and Tracy collected emails from those who expressed interest in our Temple. Rabbi Bieber met and talked with passers-by. She really knows how to connect with people! Robyn came by with a keyboard and we sang some songs, Vickie was there with Bambi. Our booth was just about where it was last year, right in front of Pinocchio's Italian restaurant. Several of us split one of their pizzas before things got busy. There is a parking lot close by that allowed for a quick pack-up and exit at the end of the night.

One of our people remarked that our booth looked "10 times better" than the one of a certain other local synagogue!

Holiday in the Park is the kick-off for the holiday season in Burbank, coming the Friday before Thanksgiving. This year Hanukkah starts in the middle of December, and it will be busy this year! Our choir performed at Shabbat services on December 12. On Wednesday, December 17, we will be at Burbank Town Center at 6:00 PM to light the Hanukkiya. Rabbi Bieber will lead the blessing and we will join together singing Hanukkah songs. December 18 is Hanukkah in the Foothills in Tujunga, starting at 4:30 PM. This evening of fun, food, and friendship is a community event organized by the Jewish community of the Foothills, and this is the 10th year of the event. Rabbi Bieber officiates at the event. Saturday, December 20 at 10:30 AM we will have Shabbat services and commemorate Marley's Bat Mitzvah. Marley has been attending services regularly and participating in the service as part of her studies with Rabbi Bieber. We are all very proud of her! We hope you will participate with us for these special events.

The holidays conclude at New Year's, and we look forward to seeing the Burbank Tournament of Roses entry in the Rose Parade, All Paws On Deck. The Burbank float is community built, and our Past-President Lisa is a volunteer every year. The float will be parked on the corner of Olive and Glenoaks starting Tuesday, January 6, 2026 for up-close viewing.
